



Who are you, Marge? I am Marge Almack, daughter of Ken and Bessie Adams (founders of CLC). Currently, I'm retired but still helping in a voluntary capacity through prayer, zoom calls, zoom prayer meetings.

How long have you worked with CLC? A lifetime, 1967-2016 (49 years as full-time workers).

When did you join CLC? I applied to CLC in 1967 to serve in Jamaica, working with the Caribbean Challenge Magazine (CC).

Why did you join CLC? I received God's calling as a 16-year-old. CC needed secretarial help with the CC at its origin. I was taking a business course in high school. Also God was bringing West Indians to our home, and I was so drawn to them. Dad was helping in Jamaica to get the magazine started. While I was in college, God brought Bill Almack into my life. He was a printer and wanted to use his experience and gifting in overseas ministry. The rest is history!

What was your favorite part about working with CLC? I was privileged to have a front row seat! I saw God

provide over and over again. As a child I saw God provide the present property for CLC USA and WEC USA. [I had the opportunity of] living in the castle and seeing God provide for all the present CLC USA buildings on the "Hill." *Editor's note*: The Hill is a term used by CLC USA members to refer to the current CLC property in Fort Washington.

What's the most unusual request that you have received? When we were on the home staff and Bill was working in the print shop, Corrie Ten Boom visited the CLC headquarters. One day she came through the print shop when Bill was printing the cover of one of her books. This particular cover had her face on it, and Bill was trying to get the color just right. Her request to Bill, "You print them, and I will sell them!"

How has working with CLC impacted your family? All 4 kids have loved living in different countries. They relate to people from many nationalities, and all of them are mission-minded. Our sons have served or are serving in missions and have been on mission committees in their churches. One of our daughters teaches in a Chinese Immersion school.

Our other daughter is married to a Missionary Kid and is very active in her church.

What would you like to tell other people that are interested in joining CLC?

Loving God's Word and being a reader of His Word and good Christian books are essential. Seeing how the Bible and Christian books have impacted lives needs to be shared. Because CLC is a Business as Mission organization, there are many ways and places where people can serve.



A GOD MOVE...

After serving in Jamaica for 3 years, Bill and I served on the home staff [CLC USA] in Fort Washington for 2 years. It was a very happy time for me! My parents were leading the work. Bill was happily working in the printshop. A request came from Trinidad that if someone didn't come to head up the CLC ministry there, it would fold. We were the only ones on the staff with any experience in the West Indies.

God spoke through speaker Paul Little, at the Urbana Missions Conference where Bill was representing CLC. Paul Little said, if God is speaking to you to





move, then you must put your key in the ignition and get started. You can't move a parked car.

We were told that no one was getting a visa to Trinidad at that time. However, we needed to put our key into the ignition, turn it on, and apply for visas. You can probably guess that God did the miracle of providing the visas and working in my heart a willingness to say yes to again move to the West Indies.

PLEASE PRAY for the Farías family as they find housing and adjust to a new country. Also please pray for Cristian and the local team as they work together.




UNITED KINGDOM

Who are you, Marcia? I'm Marcia Hartman, and I'm primarily responsible for handling customer sales for CLC Publications. I'm also involved in the acquisition end of helping to choose the manuscripts that we publish. I take care of some of the CLC USA human resources responsibilities at the CLC Headquarters, and I'm part of the leadership team for the US.

How long have you worked with CLC? January 2013, I celebrated the new year and the new thing that God was doing in my life by becoming a part of CLC!

How you joined CLC? In 2012 when I was unemployed and was praying for God's provision and leading, He assured me that the process that I was going through wasn't about me finding a job but was about His taking me to a new place of ministry. God spoke affirmation and excitement into a difficult time of transition in my life.

I heard about an opening in the Customer Service department of CLC from a prayer partner who volunteered with the ministry at the time. I knew that CLC shared a campus

with another mission (WEC) that I had previously been a part of. I wondered, was God leading me back to an old place for a new ministry? Another member in the prayer group mentioned that she, too, had volunteered at CLC in the print shop many years ago, and as she was speaking, a third woman went to a shelf and took down several books. She had grown up in India and told us that when her father became a Christian, he went straight to the ELS (CLC Ministries) bookshop in Ooty and bought Christian books for himself and his family, including the ones she had in her hands. Needless to say, it didn't come as a surprise to my prayer partners when I, too, became a part of the ministry of CLC!

What is your favorite part about working with CLC? I really enjoy talking to the customers who call in to purchase CLC publications. Some of them apologize for not being "up to the challenge" of placing an online order through our website, and they ask me to guess how old they are. I usually don't say, but I'm pretty sure that they're going to tell me that they're in their

80's or 90's! Multiple times each week I receive phone calls from customers this age who are buying books that CLC publishes. They often tell me that they "rediscovered" one of our books on a shelf and that after reading it again, they want to buy more copies to share with others. I love hearing from these fellow coworkers who are helping to distribute Christian literature!


What would you like to tell other people that are interested in joining CLC?


God will let you know if the plan He has

DOMINICA

Prayer Box

We had to close down the bookstore last year in June 2020 due to financial difficulties, but, by the grace of the Lord, we reopened in October of 2020.

When we reopened, I placed a Prayer Request Box in the shop for customers, and they are really grateful for it. We had one young girl return to tell us that she and her family have been praying for over a year now for their grandmother to get help to finish building her house, which has caused them much pain and suffering. But, since she placed her prayer request in the box at the store, construction of the grandmother's house has recommenced. As the young girl indicated, this answer from God has encouraged her to trust Jesus. I believe others have received answers, and so, to God be the glory - great things He has done. I have seen God's faithfulness, especially in how He has provided finance towards developing the bookstore. We continue to see new customers every week.



CENTRAL ASIA (CA2)

Although finances are tight, we have been assured that God wants us here. Since the pandemic started and the country went to war for a little over a month last autumn, sales of a lot of our secular English books have been low, but the demand for Christian books and Bibles in the local language has been just as strong as before, including more interest from villages in other parts of the country.

A woman came in looking for a New Testament recently. She shared that she had recently become a Christian and that she had brain cancer but that after praying, God had healed her of this cancer, even without the operation that the doctors told her she needed.

CYPRUS

Booktable Outreach

At one of our book tables, held at a local College in Nicosia, an Iranian student approached us, enquiring what it was all about and what we were selling. When we said that we were selling books concerning the Christian faith and, in reality, we were talking about the Saviour Jesus Christ, he asked us to tell him more about it. Before we finished our talk, he asked us if we could take him to a church. So we did, and from then on, we continued fellowshipping with him on a personal level, doing some private Bible studies with him. Eventually, he accepted the Lord as his Saviour. He returned back to Iran and there witnessed to his whole family, wife and two young sons and to other people, at the risk of all their lives. Then, they all returned as a family to Cyprus and were baptised in water. They were a great help for our local fellowship, both as witnesses to the Lord and


translating for us to many Iranians visiting Cyprus at the time when we were outreaching to people for the Lord. We can say that many of them heard the gospel at that time, and some of them were baptized also. At a later stage, they emigrated to Canada, where they live right now.

Seeking the Lord

Josiane, whose husband had been suffering from cancer for a year, came one day to the bookshop in Montélimar. Her husband had been in contact with the bookseller, Rodolphe, who had been able to share the gospel with him. When she first came at the end of August, her eyes were drawn to a verse on a mug: "In quietness and confidence you will be strong" Isaiah 30:15. She remembered it and wrote it down in a notebook on her way home. It's not often that a non-Christian customer tells of a verse that caught their attention in the shop. She wanted to read the Bible and learn more about it. Rodolphe offered her several books. and, as she browsed the shelves of books, her eyes fell on another book, which she bought: Sickness and Healing in God's Eyes. The Lord is powerful and leads the steps of those who seek Him in our shops. May all the glory go to Him!


Friday (3rd) - Netherlands




Wednesday (13th) - South Korea
