My name is Jim Pitman. My wife Daniela and I have been working with CLC for the last 26 years.

Both of us grew up overseas as children of missionary parents, Daniela in Nigeria and Togo, and I in Bolivia. Our parents were Bible translators, so we had literature "in our blood" from birth. Daniela and I felt that God was calling us into missions, so we began investigating opportunities. After hearing of CLC and reading the book, *Leap of Faith* by Norman Grubb, our interest was kindled, and we applied.

It was a step of faith, as we were now faced with waiting on God to supply all of our needs through donations rather than a fixed salary. I'm happy to report that we have seen God faithfully provide for every financial need that has come up over the years. Our God is faithful!

I started out working in our bookstores, while Daniela worked at home teaching our four children. For several years, I managed our CLC bookstore in Miami, Florida, and it was thrilling to see the many people who gave their lives to Christ in our bookstore there. One of the things I have loved about CLC is the wonderful people I have gotten to work with over the years. They make the difference!

We did get some unusual requests, like the customer who wanted to purchase a statue of a saint to bury in their yard so they could sell their house faster. This became a good opportunity to share the Gospel, as we explained that we could offer them something better – we could pray and ask God directly to help them! They were very moved when we took the time to do that with them!

From Miami, we moved to Philadelphia in 2002, when I was asked to take over our mission department including public relations and oversight of CLC's work in Central Asia. It was a challenge, but I enjoy analyzing and fixing things,

including departments and business entities, which became one of my primary roles here at CLC USA.

Over the next years, I found myself tasked with reinvigorating our publishing department (three years) and then overseeing our bookstores for six years until 2016.

One of the regular requests we would get in our bookstores was for Bibles in other languages. "Do you have a Bible in Italian?" a customer might ask. "No," I would say, "but I know where I can get you one." I would call Multi-Language Media (MLM) and order a Bible for that customer. "Wow, Multi-Language Media really should be part of CLC," I thought.

Over the years, when I would see the dear couple who ran MLM, Jay and Jean Krause, I would always mention my interest in keeping it going after their retirement. In 2016, I got the call I had been dreaming of - "We are ready to retire and we would like CLC to take over this ministry." A few months later, our team was packing up everything and moving it to CLC's USA headquarters in Fort Washington.

I continue to serve today on CLC USA's leadership team, and as our four children are now grown and out of the house, Daniela also works in our office in the finance department. It has been an adventure serving with CLC and God continues to grow me into the person he wants me to be.

I am grateful for His guidance and provision, and for all the wonderful coworkers he has given me in CLC!

CLC France team

Who are you, Hervé? I'm Hervé Lessous. I was born in the western part of France into a Catholic family. After I became a believer, I married Marie-Christine, and we have two children, Anne-Charlotte (now married), and Louis.

How long have you worked with CLC?

15 years.

What is your current role in CLC? I have been the National Director of CLC France since I joined CLC in 2008. I was in charge of finances, human resources, retail, sales and our publications.

In October 2022, I was elected as the Regional Director for Europe. This is a real challenge as I will be working with CLC teams from 16 countries. Because of



this, in January 2023, my role in CLC France changed. I'm now the Commercial Director in charge of the sales & marketing department and our publications.

What brought you to CLC? How did you start working in CLC? 15 years ago, we were living in Chartres, one hour from Paris. A friend of mine saw an advert for CLC France looking for a new National Director. At that time we were looking for God's will in our life as we knew we had a calling to ministry.

I went for an interview and got the position. Everything was set for a contract to start in July 2008, in Montélimar, six hours from where we lived. We prayed as a couple and with our children for this important decision. We were ready to start a new life in a new city which was a real challenge.

Since then the Lord has helped us immensely. The beginning was very hard. We had financial constraints, and I didn't know much about bookstores or book publications. We had to cease publications so that I could gain a better understanding of the industry and be ready for future investments. I also needed to meet our team and share the vision for CLC France.

My wife has participated in a behind-thescenes way in the life of CLC Montélimar. Specifically she prays, translates calendars



from German to French, and proofreads for our publications.

Describe a typical day for you.

A typical day in the office means spending a significant amount of time reading and sending emails to customers and partners and to CLC colleagues around the globe. I also have daily meetings virtually or in person.

When I am traveling out of France and working with other CLC countries, I immerse myself in the daily life of these shops to better understand the ins and outs of their operations and problems. I can then think about ways to help them to support them. If the Holy Spirit inspires me with ideas, then we can form a very accurate plan.

How has working with CLC impacted your life?

It's impacting my life and my family's. On the one hand, I like to work at CLC. It is a privilege to serve the Lord and fellow believers. On the other hand, there is a risk of focusing more on the CLC family rather than on the Lord and on my family.

How can we pray for you?

We are facing a time of significant transition. Please pray for Ollivier Quéruel who took over the National Director role for CLC France as I began my role as European Regional Director.

This is also a major change for my wife and me as I will have to spend more time traveling. There has to be a good balance between traveling and spending time together.

Please pray for my stamina and good health, especially for my high blood pressure. Pray against my having increased risk of burnout. Pray for a renewal of our spiritual life and for the wisdom of the Lord on us.









PROJECT UPDATE Books for Ukraine by Tomasz Kalisz, CLC Poland & Gary Chamberlin, International Director

After the Russian invasion into Ukraine, as refugees started to stream into neighbouring countries, we knew CLC should take action. Christian literature could be beneficial for refugees as well as housing, food and medical help. We wanted to provide relevant books for both adults and children but the funds were not available for such an urgent need. This is where our reputation as a long-standing and reliable ministry helped as people started to ask if they could donate to the project.



Initially we accessed literature already available in Ukraine, prioritising children's books in particular. As funds continued to come in we produced an economic bilingual Polish-Ukrainian children's Bible with the help of a Polish publisher.

Our excellent cooperation with Josh McDowell Ministry led us to publish a Ukrainian version of *More than a Carpenter*. Working alongside the Ukrainian Bible Society, we printed 210,000 copies of a modern Gospel

of John. Other projects that followed include: 20,000 copies of *Blotch: A Tale of Forgiveness and Grace*, an evangelistic booklet for young children; 10,000 copies of *My Name is Mariam*, a tender booklet for children dealing with issues related to being a refugee, written by a Ukrainian Christian author and friend of CLC, Nadiyka Gerbish; 60,000 copies of a children's Bibles in collaboration with Voice of the Martyrs; and, in partnership with Alpha International, 60,000 copies of the evangelistic booklet *Why Jesus*? by Nicky Gumble for teens and adults.



We have received many photos and information verifying that the books and Gospels of John have reached tens of thousands of refugees inside Ukraine and in many countries across Europe. Dozens of churches distributed the various titles to the refugees, especially in Poland, Romania and Ukraine. We have been deeply moved to see photos and short videos of these CLC books being read by children and adults hiding in bunkers, soldiers on the front lines, injured and elderly refugees, and precious children who are now orphans.

We are thankful for the individuals, churches and organizations who have offered their resources to provide this spiritual help. We believe this seed can produce the fruit of hope, reconciliation, redemption, restoration and peace for many.

We are very joyful and grateful to think that almost 500,000 books and gospels published by CLC have been distributed by our many contacts on the ground, mostly in Hungary, Poland, Romania and even Ukraine. We are thankful for the generous collaboration with other Christian publishers and organizations.

A year after the invasion of Ukraine the needs are still huge, especially among internally displaced refugees now living in central and western Ukraine. As the Lord continues to provide, we hope to reprint 30,000 copies of the *Illustrated Bible* for children before Easter (see cover photo). In addition, we are exploring the possibility of establishing CLC in Ukraine when the war is over. If you would like to donate, please see page 23.
