At the beginning of the year, our team received a visit from the CLC Africa Director Liz Patten, and the CLC Europe Director. Hervé Lessous.

They evaluated the ministry and gave us some counsel as to measures we could take to improve our current situation. At the end of the year, we were informed that the shop premises had been sold by the landlord, and we have to vacate the property by June 2024. We are facing great challenges, but we trust God that He will make a way.

A highlight of the year was the first CLC Francophone Conference, held in Ivory Coast. We are thankful for the unity among the various delegates and their desire to support and help each other to succeed in the ministry. We also enjoyed participating in the CLC Global Prayer Days organised on Zoom by the International Office.

Lastly, with the help of CLC France and funds from the Rudy Kuijer CLC Evangelistic Fund, we were able to print thousands of tracts which were then shared between CLC Benin.

# Burkina Faso

2023 was a very difficult year for us because of the ongoing political, religious, social, and economic tensions in the country. This has certainly affected our sales and our cash flow situation. It is difficult to order new stock. however we do our best with what we have. and we keep open for long hours in the hope of better sales. Mostly I, Luc, am alone in the bookshop, but on Mondays I am joined by Gérard, a CLC retiree. We both like to attend conventions and take books and Bibles to the provinces for different events. We have enjoyed using the CLC vehicle for this. However, with the current and ongoing threats of terrorism we are no longer able to travel as widely as before. We are grateful to God for answering our prayers for safety for ourselves and our families as well as our customers and church families, and we continue to pray for peace in our country.

A highlight of this year was to attend the first CLC Francophone Conference in Ivory Coast. The theme was "Stronger Together, Weaker Apart" We also benefitted from the Rudy Kuijer CLC Evangelistic Fund with the printing of several thousand tracts in French for distribution.



# Côte d'Ivoire(Ivory Coast)

We are very thankful to God for another year of viability in both our bookshops Abidjan and in Bouaké. In Abidjan, had we some staff changes as younger team members moved

on to pursue other goals.

In February we hosted the first CLC Francophone Conference with representatives from Benin, Burkina Faso, Benin, Canada and France. The International Director, Gary Chamberlin, was also present, together with Liz Patten, the CLC Africa Director. It was a wonderful time to get to know each other better so that we may work together more effectively in serving God's Kingdom purposes. Our theme for the conference was "Stronger Together, Weaker Apart."

In July, we were awarded the Gold Palm prize for best bookshop for which we give all glory to the LORD.



In June 2014 we applied for a D.F.E. (Fiscal Declaration of Existence), to allow us permission to operate freely as a non-profit organisation. This permission was granted in 2023. This was our biggest answer to prayer.

We look forward to 2024 knowing that the LORD, who has seen us through our challenges in 2023, will continue to be faithful!

# Kenya

The Partnership Department made strides in creating collaborations and expanding our network. We welcomed new partners thus enhancing the diversity and reach of our collaborations.

After four and a half years of being on an offsite location, we are opening a new bookshop at the Nairobi Pentecostal Bible College where we are set to launch the bookshop in 2024. Praise the Lord for this opportunity!

We participated in the Nairobi International Book Fair. This event allowed us to display our books and services on an international platform and led to the establishment of new partnerships.

This year, we had the privilege of conducting two writing classes: Diamond and Topaz. We are pleased that 17 writers graduated from these classes with complete drafts of their manuscripts that have now been moved to the publishing stage. God has continued to inspire His people to write. The next class for 2024 already has 17 writers. The group of writers hailing from South Africa expressed their deep gratitude to the CLC Kenya team for their unwavering support throughout their writing journey. They felt greatly encouraged by the team's guidance and assistance towards achieving their writing goals.

# 💳 Mozambique

Population: 32.5 million (11.1% Evangelical) Date CLC work began: 1966 Ministry: 3 Bookshops Director: Elizabeth Patten Bestsellers: The Purpose Driven Life, Ministers' Manual



Looking back on 2023 we have much to be thankful for! One of our main prayer requests in the past few years was to find a way to consolidate shipments of our orders from Brazil with one Brazilian publisher to reduce costs. We are grateful that the Lord has answered this prayer.

Another highlight of the year was the annual FIEL conference in July. CLC Maputo was asked to organize Bible sales and the sale of all the publisher's books which was a mammoth task considering the very short time we had. With the Lord's help, our team managed to sort out the books in time, resulting in very good sales.

Even though the cost of books has risen dramatically over the year, we have seen an increase in sales in Beira and Nampula. This is largely due to the economy Bibles that we printed and which are in great demand.



We are grateful for having established a closer working relationship with CLC Portugal, which we trust will benefit both countries.

We might face many challenges, but we trust that the Lord, who

has proven Himself to be faithful, will see us through.

# **Sierra Leone:**

Population: 8.9 million (3.9% Evangelical) Date CLC work began: 1966 Ministry: 3 Bookshops Director: David Scouler Bestsellers: Pastor's Pal, Engagement Bible



2023 was a positive year for the ministry despite the country experiencing some tension. We still encounter regular periods of power outages. Our headquarters in Freetown was subject to acts of vandalism this year. We were unable to trace the perpetrators, but a night security staff has been employed.

With extensive fund raising we were able to purchase a motorised tricycle (known as a "kéké") for outreach. The kéké, originally intended to be used in Freetown, is now being put to full use in Bo City. This is due to staffing changes in Freetown when CLC said goodbye to George Kapindi after almost 20 years in the ministry.

We also raised funds for the construction of a new bookshop in Bo City which would free us from rent. We now have a lease for 25 years with a very minimal rent.

Through a partnership with Crossway Publishers in the US, we distributed "Pastors Packs" with study materials. We put these into the hands of those least able to take advantage of the materials in our shops, including in rural areas.

There were visits by the National Director and the African Regional Director in March and again in November when they were able to participate in the official opening of the new bookshop.

After praying for six years, we finally began construction work for our new facility in Chennai in March 2023. This project is a testament to the faithfulness of God, and the dedication of our team. Also, our Secunderabad branch recently relocated. We are grateful to God for providing us with a beautiful new facility there.

By God's grace, we were able to supply a total of 2,500 copies of English Bibles and 500 Children's Bibles to a closed country. It is a blessing to provide these resources where access to Bibles is restricted.

Another achievement this year was translating and printing the *Genesis Genealogies* in Tamil. The publication of this book has been an encouragement for Tamil readers.

This time he was able to visit several of our bookshops which was a source of motivation and encouragement for our team.

We are grateful and praise God for the opportunity to collaborate with the Kalam Kudus Church. They offered us the possibility of printing a biography about the Rev. Jusuf Citra, an Indonesian Chinese Missionary. Rev. Citra was the founder of several Christian schools and churches in Papua. His life and ministry were greatly influenced by the work of Grace Chang, a CLC Missionary who was involved in the CLC ministry in Indonesia during the 1970s. Over the course of a year, we have been immensely grateful for the numerous opportunities to showcase and distribute the book.

We have also had the privilege of setting up book tables at various meetings, seminars, and workshops held in Manado.

In December we celebrated the first



anniversary of the bookshop in Manado. We praised God for His faithfulness throughout this journey. the number of bookshops in Japan rapidly decreases, and people read less, we face many challenges. However, our existence continues to hold great importance and meaning

To make an impact beyond the shop, we have placed Bibles and used books in our shopfront for passersby to take home freely.

Our Triangle Café, adjacent to the bookshop, helps introduce our shop to the Triangle Café



public. We are serving the community not only with bread but with the Bread of Life.

A highlight in November was the privilege of hosting Romualdo Macinas, the Asia Regional Director, and his wife Deedah. It was a time of fellowship, getting to know CLC co-workers, and learning more about CLC. Their visit was a tremendous encouragement to our Japan team and leaders.

As we faced many challenges, we also saw a fulfilled dream, the opening of a second bookshop. The shop is located in the northern part of Yangon city, where a large number of Christians and Seminaries are located. This bookshop is bigger, and there is even room for storage.

We can also testify that our bookstalls increased compared to previous years. We even sold 1,000 copies of the Burmese Bible in one day. Praise the Lord!





# **C**Pakistan

Despite the challenges faced in our country, we have experienced the incredible provision of the Lord. We are grateful for the support and

prayers of the CLC family, which has helped us to survive and continue our work.

Living in Pakistan means facing difficulties due to political and religious issues, especially during times of war. Inflation has increased resulting in fewer people visiting our shop. Additionally, the weekly protests by the various religious groups have affected our sales.

Despite the challenges, we are grateful that by the grace of God, we have been able to make a profit for the second time in 35 years. We continue to look up to God and have hope for further progress in the coming years.

Participating in the Manila International Bookfair and the Department of Education's Book Exhibition provided us with an opportunity to reach the secular market. We are grateful to our foreign suppliers for sponsoring our booth at these events where we established new connections and made substantial sales.

We held DVBS workshops and seminars focused on handling the Word, preaching, and church leadership. We are grateful for the participation of over 300 people.

We celebrated our 66th anniversary with a Pastors' appreciation event discussing the topic,"The Minister, His Calling, and the Law," followed by questions and answers on legal matters.

We praise the Lord for the opportunity to not only provide Christian literature but also participate in the spiritual growth and development of our Filipino brothers and sisters.

# 💽 South Korea

Population: 51.9 million (16.8% Evangelical) Date CLC work began: 1975 Ministry: Covenant Theological Seminary, Publishing, Web sales, Wholesale Director: Young-Ho Park Bestsellers: Reverberations of Faith, A Daily Devotion of an Unemployed Pastor



CLC Korea had a blessed year in 2023. We started the year grateful for receiving awards from the Korean Christian Publishing Association for translating *Exposition to Romans* written by Robert Haldane, and for excellence in the youth book categories for the first time.

For Easter, we created a free audiobook version of *The Easter Storybook* recorded by Sohee Yoo. It was challenging to read, record, and edit 40 stories, with pictures, in just a few days but we received very good feedback from many people.

We felt that A Daily Devotion of an Unemployed Pastor - When God calls to Pause, written by a Korean pastor and published by us, was a particularly important project. This is because there are so many unemployed pastors or pastors being asked to leave their current church in Korea. We printed 1,000 copies, and soon we sold out and did reprints in the summer.

We are grateful to wrap up the year 2023 having published 124 new titles and 17 titles to reprint, despite not having enough editors, and designers to do the work! We believe this year was fruitful because we received so many prayers from follower CLCers and worldwide prayer partners. We want to thank you all.

We are profoundly thankful to the Lord for His guidance throughout 2023. We have countless reasons to express our gratitude to God.

We were delighted to host a book table once again at the 'Big Christian Conference'. It was also

encouraging to see customers gradually returning to our bookshop. Witnessing them purchase Bibles and Christian books brought us immense joy. Serving them is indeed a great privilege.

Our top-selling items include Thai Bibles and Children's Bibles, English Bibles, and tracts. This is encouraging as we know that Thai churches continue to grow and the number of new believers is increasing. We hope that Thai people everywhere will open their hearts to Jesus as their Saviour.



CLC Thailand faced challenging situation due to a dispute over the Chiang Mai building. However, we are grateful that the Lord granted us victory in May 2023, and we were able to reclaim the building. We are currently in the process of registering the foundation under the name CLC Ministry, as we are affiliated with the Evangelical Fellowship of Thailand. We look forward to a smooth and swift completion of this process.



# EUROPE & CENTRAL ASIA

2023 was a very special year for me as it was my first year as the European Regional Director.

Our region is made up of 16 countries with 15 different languages and very big cultural differences.

The percentage of evangelical people varies between 0.2 % (Central Asia 2) and 8.8% (UK) of the population and shows a contrasting pattern of religious activity. Catholic, Orthodox and Islam are often the main religions today in our European and Central Asian countries.

There was major turmoil in some of our countries, but we saw the faithful hand of the Lord over the ministry.

The work is difficult, but we are so grateful to the Lord for overall good sales in 2023, and new staff members in the European countries.

I was able to visit some countries this year and had meetings via Zoom, but I am looking forward to visiting all the countries in the region.

In 2023 we had our first francophone conference in Ivory Coast which improved relationships with France, Canada and the French-speaking countries in Africa. The next conference should be hosted in France in 2025. Praise the Lord!

During 2023, we were extremely grateful that we could participate in two big events - the ministry expo 'Come and See' and a conference for young leaders to which we were specifically invited by the organisers.

We praise the Lord that after nearly ten years, we were finally able to put in an air conditioning unit in the bookstore. It has been very challenging for us during the summer heat and the cold months of the year before the city turns on the central heating.

We were hoping to find one new full-time person to join our staff this year, but we are grateful that we have three new parttime people who are covering many of the responsibilities we needed help with.



We feel that God is working on expanding our ministry, which can be seen in the significant increase in sales over the last couple of years.

One of the three books we have published has sold out, and we are preparing to do a reprint, which is a big encouragement for us. We continue to see God's grace and faithfulness in many ways, especially in our everyday needs.

# Central Asia (CA1)

**Population:** 6 million (0.7% Evangelical) Date CLC work began: 1996 Ministry: 1 Bookshop Bestsellers: The 5 Love Languages, Charles Spurgeon book series



Despite the interference to our sales caused by the free distribution of books, we are arateful to God for the constant income from the apartment property we can rent out. We are also grateful to our neighbouring CLC team, who continues to prepare and ship

books and materials for our shop.

We placed an order of books and Christmas goods from a neighbouring country with the hope of receiving the shipment at the beginning of December.

Due to inclement weather and one of the main highways being closed, the shipment was delayed three times, with the arrival date finally set for January 2nd, 2024. This meant our customers were not going to receive

their orders before Christmas and our sales would be greatly affected. We prayed intensely then and, on 23rd, December received we the message that the cargo had arrived been and had delivered. Praise the Inside the shop



Lord! Our customers were excited and even asked us to keep the shop open until the New Year!

# **Central Asia (CA2)**

It was our dream for years to publish a largeprint Bible in addition to children's books. It was a step of faith for us, but we printed 1,100 copies of large-print Bibles! Please pray that we will be able to make the payments for this print run when they are due. We can testify that each time we had an urgent need to make payments and pay suppliers, God sent us more customers and we had enough money to cover expenses. We are so grateful.

Praise the Lord we were able to run the book stalls at quite a number of conferences and other Christian events. We began the renovation of the bookshop, and the shop has become lighter and brighter. At the moment, we are continuing the renovation of the office premises.

We changed the Internet hosting service and, with the help of the digital team, the website is working better now.

We had a customer who bought a big and expensive book, *Biblical Doctrine: A Systematic Summary of Bible Truth*, by John MacArthur and Richard Mayhue. # **Switzerland**

Since we no longer operate a physical bookstore, we have no stock for book tables. Nevertheless, we've managed to stay active in two recent events - one in collaboration with Open Doors and another at the annual gathering of Christian entrepreneurs in Ticino. During the latter event, Carlo had the privilege of sharing a personal testimony and recounting the CLC story.

In the past months, we've been diligently working on introducing a Portuguese section to our Swiss website. We discovered that over 3% of Swiss residents are Portuguese speakers, so this is a great opportunity for us to provide literature to people in their native language. Italian is spoken by 7% of the Swiss population. The Lord willing, we will also incorporate products in French, a language spoken by 20% of the population.

In addition to these efforts, we've navigated the logistical challenge of relocating our shared office space. Thankfully, through God's grace, we've secured a solution without incurring extra costs. While this transition has consumed some of our time, we're grateful to be settled into our new space.

The main focus of our work is the distribution warehouse, which has grown significantly although the work has also become more complex. The warehouse is very full, and we have faced the double pressures of trying to reduce stock levels as well as supplying an everwidening range of stock more efficiently.

We took the decision to install a Print-on-Demand facility in our warehouse. Inevitably, a lot of attention and energy was dedicated to the project, but it was completed by the end of 2023. We trust that this facility will be of great benefit to publishers so that they can hold smaller quantities of their titles and reprint them on a regular basis. It is clear that an increasing proportion of the books we distribute are sold online - well over 50% - and so it is an area in which we need to excel.

Our work at events and conferences grew significantly, and we were able to host a mini tour by Gary Chapman promoting the *Five Love Language* series of books. The two conferences that we organize - 'Mission Worship' and 'Hand-in-Hand' - were held as physical events again after three years online.

We published a book on the important topic of infertility titled *The Wait*, and it was one of the first books to come off the Print-on-Demand equipment.

We made nine trips in the bookmobile to different areas of Colombia, allowing us to better serve our customers. We participated with book tables in more than 60 events throughout the country. Through the Thompson Bible Seminar, we were able to train 1,797 people in the use of the Thompson Bible.

Our 32nd annual National Book Summit was held in the city of Bogotá, with the participation of 14 publishers, and 200 booksellers from different towns in Colombia.

Through the Social Foundation, we trained 2,700 people as literacy teachers. In addition, we donated books and provided humanitarian support, including medical treatment for those in need.

Given that the National Director works remotely from Chile, visits to Peru have been a significant source of motivation for the local team. CLC Chile has been instrumental in providing essential resources for the director's support and travel to Peru. We also thank God for the support from CLC Ecuador and CLC Colombia, and for the opportunity for three members of our team to attend the CLC conference for the Americas in Colombia.

We were grateful for the visit from our International Director, Gary Chamberlin, and our Regional Director, David Pabón, who were very helpful in analysing our local situation, providing ideas for development and proposing improvements.

2023 was a year of many changes for CLC Venezuela. There was a change of the President of the foundation and also of the Board of Directors. These changes require large amounts of extensive, slow and expensive paperwork. Praise the Lord, we will be able to update the legal side of the foundation. We still face challenges as every day there are new guidelines, and legal changes that we need to comply with.

As a testimony, we must say that we have managed to pay our staff on time, and even provide two small Christmas bonuses in December. We also testify that, with the help of CLC Colombia, we have



been able to buy new merchandise. This was good for our customers, as they are often on the lookout for new materials and resources.

A pastor who works with a group of missionaries bought a large amount of *Jesus Para Todos* (Jesus for All) economy Bibles and distributed them to the Guajira people, an indigenous group of Venezuela, many of whom did not have access to God's Word. Thank you for your prayers and support for us.

We moved our distribution warehouse to a new location in 2023. It is 85% larger than our old warehouse and this forced us to make significant organisational changes to ensure the continuity of operations. We created new positions and hired new employees. In summary of our highlights, challenges, and how the Lord answered our pravers in 2023, we can report that God provided!

He provided unexpected grants and funds to meet our needs and to enable us to share with others. We also saw His provision in the form of a 3-year renewal lease for our CLC bookstore. He provided committed workers, customers, and supporters for the ministry. He provided new partnerships for the production, distribution, and transport of His word. He provided an opportunity for us to fellowship as a team and for several staff to connect internationally at the regional conference.

He provided unity within the membership in deciding on a new leadership structure and in choosing the three staff who now collectively serve as the US Leadership Team. He provided willing Inside the shop



workers to step up when our Publisher stepped down. We are so thankful for all of God's provision as we look back over the past year knowing that we can continue to trust Him in the year to come!



### Week 9 - (March 1st to 3rd) AFRICA

*Friday (1st) - Benin:* Last year, we gave thanks that our landlord's plans to sell our bookshop were abandoned. However, in the meantime the premises have been sold and we need to vacate by the month of June 2024. Please pray as we search for a suitable new place, conveniently situated but at an affordable price in the current unfavourable business climate.

The Weekend (2nd - 3rd) - Benin: Pray that the national economic situation will improve significantly for the good of the people of our country as well as for the CLC ministry. In the meantime, pray for some extraordinary sales to help us with our struggling cash flow. Also pray that we may improve and increase our presence on social media in order to better attract customers, both new and old.

### Week 10 - (March 4th to 10th) AFRICA

*Monday (4th) - Benin:* For many years, we have been praying that in the long term, the LORD will give us our own premises for CLC ministry here. Please continue to pray with us for this until the moment of our breakthrough. We believe that this is a major key to our future sustainability.

*Tuesday (5th) - Burkina Faso:* Pray for an end to the terrorist conflict, which has been going on here for the past five years. In 2022, the country suffered two coups d'état: in January and September. Then, in December, there was an attack on a military camp by a group of 3,000 men in the town of Djibo, which is 210 km. from the capital, Ouagadougou.

Wednesday (6th) - Burkina Faso: Pray for the resilience of our team so that, despite these difficult times, CLC continues to be a source of blessing for Burkina Faso, providing Bibles, books and other resources along with a word of encouragement and a listening ear. Some customers ask us to pray for those to whom they will be offering a book or a Bible, and this we do gladly.

*Thursday (7th) - Burkina Faso:* Pray for the protection of our small team, Luc and Gérard, when they go out with book stands at various events and for their safety in the shop. Pray for wisdom in knowing how far afield to go since all travel is potentially dangerous due to the situation in the country.

*Friday (8th) - Ivory Coast:* The administrator for the premises where the CLC bookshop in Abidjan is located told us that the rent would increase by 15% from April 2024. He pointed out to us that the law allows rent increases every three years. Pray that

our negotiations to limit the increase to 10% will be accepted.

The Weekend (9th - 10th) - Ivory Coast: Please support us in prayer as we seek qualified people who are committed to the Lord to join our teams in Bouaké and Abidjan so that we may further develop the work in our country. We have had a number of helpers join us in recent years but, so far, none have remained for the long term, and this is a big concern for our shop managers.

### Week 11- (March 11th to 17th) AFRICA/ASIA

*Monday (11th) - Ivory Coast:* Our International Office has launched the idea of a possible project for a well-located building to house a third CLC bookshop and a distribution centre to serve the West Africa francophone region. Pray for God's leading and direction, wisdom and discernment to know if, when and how this might come to fruition.

Tuesday (12th) - Kenya: Please pray for a new bookshop initiative at a Bible college in Nairobi. Pray for the launch event (set for March 2024), shop staff, the customers, and the space provided, that the presence of God will be manifested. Pray that God will bless our partnership with the Bible college.

*Wednesday (13th) - Kenya:* Please pray with us that CLC Kenya will faithfully and capably mentor the leaders for the ACABA\* Gala 2024 in Uganda - that they will not be afraid to host the programme but will take a step of faith and discover that God is enabling them for the task. (\*African Christian Authors' Book Awards).

*Thursday (14th) - Kenya:* Please join us in praying for the refining of our publishing infrastructure so that all the books published by CLC Kenya will be good examples of editorial and design excellence on the African continent.

Friday (15th) - Mozambique: There has been an unexpected delay in the production of our third print run of low-cost Bibles due to a "system error" at the publishers. Consequently, the Bibles, due to arrive in February, will not now arrive until June. Please pray that there will be no further delay as these are the lowest cost Bibles that we are able to supply to our customers and they are very popular.

*The Weekend (16th -17th) - Mozambique:* Pray for our bookshop in Beira, where the missionary who has overseen our work for the past 15+ years has just relinquished that responsibility due to semiretirement. Pray for the possibility of a new missionary who can help us in the same way. Also pray for



someone who can assist or substitute Sacramento (who serves alone in the shop) as and when needed.

### Week 12 - (March 18th to 24th) AFRICA

*Monday (18th) - Mozambique:* Please pray for our bookshop in Nampula, northern Mozambique. At the end of January, Isaque left us to pastor a small group of new believers in Pemba, Cabo Delgado. Pray for God's blessing upon him and his little family as they adjust to this huge step. Pray also for brother Sangara, a final year seminary student, who has replaced brother Isaque.

Tuesday (19th) - Sierra Leone: Please pray for the provision of a good supply of stock to arrive in Sierra Leone from the UK and the USA at the right intervals. Pray for David Scouler as he liaises with the different publishers and distributors in order to acquire the best deals, and pray, too, for the shipping and customs processes that are both complex and costly.

Wednesday (20th) - Sierra Leone: Please pray for a new staff member with the required skill set to join the team at the headquarters in Freetown. We are looking for someone with a good working knowledge of basic computer programmes and who is adept with social media for the purposes of outreach and marketing.

*Friday (22nd) - French-speaking countries:* We thank God for strengthening the fellowship among the five French-speaking countries of CLC, Benin, Burkina Faso, Canada, France and Ivory Coast. Please pray that the working relationship between these countries will also continue to grow so that more books and Bibles may be made available to those who are seeking God.

Please pray for our personnel as they continue to seek the best way forward to grow CLC's mission on the African continent. In this regard, pray especially for Gary Chamberlin, Hervé Lessous and Liz Patten. Pray that God will help them to understand the particular needs of this great continent and how CLC can be a blessing there.

**Monday (25th)** - **India:** Please pray for the ongoing building project in Chennai that we will have all the finances and that the workmanship will be carried out to a high standard. *Friday (19th) - CA2:* Please pray for our new National Director as she trains staff and learns to delegate some tasks as appropriate. Also pray for her in planning ahead as she grows in balancing the "urgent vs. important" - something we must all learn! .

*The Weekend (20th - 21st) - Cyprus:* Pray that our evangelistic efforts to direct people to the Lord may result in their response to Him and that they will receive Him in their hearts in truth and reality. Pray that real fruit may be yielded to Him - fruit that will abide (John 15:5).

Please pray that God will bless us with wisdom leading to yet further growth and that we may have an even wider distribution reach among the French-speaking populations globally.

*Friday (26th) - France:* Please join us in giving thanks for three of our team members who have retired in recent months: Anne Marie and Pascal (from the headquarters in Montélimar) as well as Denis (Grenoble bookshop). May the Lord accompany them in this significant change of season in their lives. CLC France is very grateful for their service over many years.

The Weekend (27th - 28th) - France: We were delighted to complete the renovation of our Montpellier bookshop in 2023. We were also looking for a new staff member to take over and so we praise God that we could integrate Sarah into the team. Several games already exist, so we want to bring them together and develop new ones. A game designer is joining the team for this purpose!

*Tuesday (30th) - France:* We thank God for our Board of Directors. After more than 10 years as Chairman, Edgar Cazaban has handed over to former Vice-Chairman Fredy Stanicki, and Eric Perier has taken over as Vice-Chairman. In addition, after several decades, Marie France Arena has passed the baton to Mme. Elisabeth Allier as secretary. Our appreciation goes to them all for their dedication to CLC.

Wednesday (1st) - France: We are thankful for the good team atmosphere in the bookstores, at our head office and in our logistics department. We are also grateful that we have been able to improve the working environment to make it more cohesive. Last, but not least, we are grateful for the sales that continue to grow and enable us to carry out numerous projects.

Thursday (2nd) - Germany: Please pray for the health and strength of our team and for God's guidance as we make purchasing decisions with regards to our stock. We want to be able to offer "spiritually



healthy" titles to our customers! Pray that we will always be sensitive to their needs.

*Friday (3rd) - Hungary:* We are planning to print good-quality journals. Please pray for the process, such as design and layout, for a good printer who is able to produce them and for the distribution of the journals.

The Weekend (4th - 5th) - Italy: Please pray for the relationship with our suppliers, for improved communications and for timely notifications about new publications so that we may always have these for our customers. Also, please pray that as the work increases, we may find suitable volunteers for our bookshops. This is difficult in the current challenging economic times.

### Week 19 - (May 6th to 12th) Europe

*Monday (6th) - Italy:* Since the previous Warehouse Manager relocated, we have been redistributing his tasks among the other staff. Pray with us that we may be able to find a second part-time worker for our warehouse, which is especially necessary in the busiest months (starting in September and continuing until February of the following year).

Tuesday (7th) - Poland: Please pray for Eva Rymer and our small team in Katowice that our bookshop continues to be a lighthouse on the busy street where it is located. Pray that our staff will have a "word in season" to encourage and bless the ones who visit us. Pray, too, for wisdom in deciding ministry activities going forward, including possibilities for publishing in the Polish language.

Wednesday (8th) - Portugal: After much prayer and asking God for an additional staff member, we are so thankful for Patricia who joined us full time at the beginning of this year. Please pray that with Patricia on board, our small team may be further enabled to make the most of the many outreach opportunities that come our way on a regular basis, sometimes involving travel to other parts of the country.

Thursday (9th) - Romania: We are very thankful for the staff whom God has brought to us, and we pray for God's blessing upon them and their families. Also, He has helped us to catch up considerably with our publishing programme, which fell behind during the pandemic. Please pray that we may complete this task.

Friday (10th) - Romania: Please pray for God's help regarding some changes in our legal accountancy,

which require a new intervention from an IT programmer in order to implement the latest requirements in our internal invoicing system. The system (called Euro-Invoice) is connected with our stock system and now needs to be connected with the Fiscal Legal System.

The Weekend (11th - 12th) - Romania: Please pray for protection over the CLC property since a neighbour has initiated legal action against some other neighbours, including CLC. We ask that our property may not be affected negatively in any way. We also need God's help to find a good roof repairer, so thank you for praying for this too!

# Week 20 - (May 13th to 19th) EUROPE & LATIN AMERICA

*Monday (13th) - EE2:* We are thankful for God's answers to prayer! One such was that we finished a year of national crisis in our country with a profit. Another is that our tenant (a Christian) made progress health wise and also in his business challenges. Although he still has a long road ahead of him, we give thanks for what God has done so far.

*Tuesday (14th) - Switzerland:* We do not have a physical bookshop, but we do operate an online service. Even so, we pray that we will have opportunities to set up mini book tables as in previous years so that we can serve and bless our brothers and sisters in Christ. We are also working on a Portuguese subsection of our website, and we pray that this will be truly helpful.

Wednesday (15th) - United Kingdom: Pray for the development of our Print-on-Demand project as we are seek to lower the cost and improve the quality of the books we produce. We will be communicating with publishers to see how we can best serve them. We also plan to investigate what we can print apart from books, all with the intention of sharing the Good News of Jesus.

Thursday (16th) - United Kingdom: Pray for all our IT staff working with the websites and systems. Their work is essential to communicate well with those who connect with us via our websites. Their work is often very technical but all with the purpose of providing a satisfying experience online.

*Friday* (17th) - United Kingdom: Pray for our warehouse staff in Sandycroft. They do a vital work ensuring that the orders are sent out rapidly, but their work is largely hidden away. It is a very physical job, so pray for bodily strength and health.



The Weekend (18th - 19th) - Chile: Pray for a new location for our warehouse, either to lease or buy. The current property is leased, but the owners have a sale agreement with the Chilean government. We are still looking for a good option that involves many variables, but we are confident in the Lord's provision. Pray we will find something before the imminent sale of the current leased property.

### Week 21 - (May 20th to 26th) LATIN AMERICA

*Monday (20th) - Chile:* Pray for needed new workers for some of our branches, that God will send believers with firm convictions and a commitment to the work. Also pray for two properties owned by the ministry: one is for sale and the other is in the process of being improved so that we may lease it out.

*Tuesday (21st) - Colombia:* Pray for God's blessing and further growth in all areas of the ministry in Colombia - the bookshops, distribution warehouse, the website, the social foundation and the mobile ministry as well as other outreach activities. Pray for those who take the vehicle into remote areas to bring God's Word and good Christian books to those who need them there.

*Wednesday (22nd) - Ecuador:* We hope to have some authors from overseas visit Ecuador this year. Pray that God will guide the various publishers and the schedules of these authors that they will be a blessing for our country.

Pray with us for the new location of our distribution centre and for the opportunity to open two new bookshops this year.

*Friday (24th) - Panama:* We continue to thank God for the acquisition of the building for the construction of "La Plaza CLC David", and we ask for prayer for all the construction plans and processes, including for the financial provision for this great project.

*The Weekend (25th - 26th) - Peru:* We thank God for the many visits to Christian schools we could make last year - nearly 40 in total. In some, we had book tables and in others we explored the possibility of incorporating our books into the curriculum. Pray that God will continue to open these doors so that we may strengthen the ministry in the schools.

### Week 22 - (May 27th to June 2nd) LATIN AMERICA

*Monday (27th) - Peru:* Due to our fragile financial situation, several measures must be taken this year to keep costs low while increasing distribution. Please pray for this increase so that we may continue to grow and be financially healthy.

*Tuesday (28th) - Peru:* God has been leading us to consider how our publishing ministry, "Buena Tierra" (Good Soil), can strengthen and grow. One possibility could be that it is taken over by another publishing house (with more resources than CLC Peru) that is interested in its special work. We ask for your prayers that God may guide and bless as we try to find the best way forward.

Wednesday (29th) - Peru: The manager of the Trujillo bookshop shares this testimony: "A frequent customer recently bought the book Maternidad Redimida (Redeemed Motherhood). This lady has seven children and mentioned that this title has been one of the best on motherhood that she has read. She added that she loves the bookshop as it is a way for her and many others to access good resources".

Thursday (30th) - Peru: A customer came to the bookshop, upset about her marriage and hinting that she wanted to separate. We spoke with her and recommended the book Pacto Matrimonial (Marriage Pact). After some time, she returned and told us that she was already in a better relationship with her husband. She said that the book helped her to understand many things and that her marriage was restored.

*Friday (31st) - Uruguay:* Please pray that God will bring us the right personnel who will be committed to the mission of CLC, and that our distribution and ministry levels will continue to grow. We also need to change our accounting and sales programme, so please pray for wisdom in the related decision-making.

The Weekend (June 1st - 2nd) - Venezuela: Pray that we can meet our expenses and improve salaries for our staff. Pray that we may continue to import new merchandise and thereby renew our inventory. Also, pray that we may enter into partnerships with other organisations so that our CLC Foundation will reach new places and become more widely known.

*Monday (3rd) - Antigua & Barbuda:* This year, we desire to increase our outreach to the surrounding community and the entire country, thus creating more interest in the bookshop. As part of this, please pray for us to be able to use social media more effectively and to have more opportunities to do book tables.

*Tuesday (4th) - Barbados:* Please join us in giving thanks for the Lord's continued financial provision, including special donations from CLC USA and the CLC International Office, and please pray that we will have wisdom to take advantage of an improved economy.

Wednesday (5th) - Barbados: Our long-term prayer request has been that we may finally acquire the land next door, which would give us some muchneeded parking space for our customers! We look forward to being able to inform you that this has come to pass, but, at this point, we are still praying for this breakthrough!

*Thursday (6th) - Canada:* Given the economic realities of our location, we thank God especially for last year's increases in both our retail and wholesale departments. Please pray with us for this trend to continue!

*Friday (7th) - Canada:* We are still in a transition period for staff serving in strategic positions within the organisation. Pray that this transition goes smoothly and that the Lord supports and strengthens us through these changes.

The Weekend (8th - 9th) - Canada: We are currently working on redesigning our website to facilitate online sales. Pray that we may successfully complete this project. Meanwhile, we remain thankful that our online sales are stable.
