HOPE AT A BOOKSHOP DOOR


A testimony from the book, Leap of Faith




"Jesus! How can Jesus help me?' questioned the customer further.

A Permanent Home for CLC Kenya

For nearly two decades, CLC Kenya has been faithfully serving the Lord by publishing, distributing, and mentoring—equipping the Church and nurturing a new generation of African authors. Now, by God's grace, a long-awaited dream is becoming reality: the establishment of our first permanent headquarters.



Milestones of Faith

At the close of 2024, we acquired four acres of land in Tinga-Oltepesi, Kajiado County, about 68 km (42 miles) southwest of Nairobi. This was

more than a land purchase; it was a testimony to God's faithfulness since our beginning in 2007.

The choice of Oltepesi was deliberate. With a population of almost six million, Nairobi continues to grow in this direction. With the Magadi Road highway under development, the area will soon be even more accessible. For us, Oltepesi offers not just strategic value but also the serenity needed for mentoring authors and hosting ministry initiatives.

In May 2025, a fence was built around the property, and the first steps were taken to transform the land into a place of ministry.

By October, construction began on the ground floor of a two-storey administration block that will eventually



house the heart of our work—offices for CLC Publishing & Printing, the African Christian Authors Book Award (ACABA), and Mama Africa Book Box (MABB).

A Vision Beyond Buildings

This new headquarters is not simply an administrative centre. It is being designed as a Kingdom hub—featuring retreat space for writers and creatives, and a conference centre for the wider Body of Christ. Set away from the noise of the city but close enough for accessibility, Oltepesi will be a place where discipleship, creativity, and collaboration flourish.

As we look ahead, we are filled with gratitude—for God's provision and for the partners, friends, and prayer supporters who have walked this journey with us. A Daughter Remembers: The Faith That Built a Global Ministry

an interview with Marge Almack, daughter of Ken and Bessie Adams by CLC World Staff & Marge Almack

When you ask Marge Almack about her parents—Ken and Bessie Adams, the founders of CLC International—her answer comes quickly and without hesitation. She doesn't talk first about their accomplishments or the global impact of their work. She talks about Jesus.

"They wanted new believers to know for sure that Jesus is God and God's Son—our Redeemer," Marge reflects. "Providing God's Word and evangelical Christian literature that affirms this truth was essential to them. It was about keeping people rooted in Christ and away from false teaching."

That conviction, simple but powerful, became the "why" that carried Ken and Bessie across oceans, to unfamiliar places, and into lives they could never have imagined touching. It also became the foundation of what we now know as CLC International: a ministry whose mission is to honour God by making Christian literature and resources available to all



nations, to help people come to faith and maturity in the Lord Jesus Christ.

A Life Shaped by Daily Faith

For Ken and Bessie, faith was never just private—it shaped everything. "They were daily in the Word and in prayer," Marge recalls. "They were one in heart and mind. Dad was the visionary. Mum was a woman of faith and trust and had an evangelistic heart."

That steady rhythm of prayer and Scripture was the compass for every decision. When opportunities came, they sought God. When difficulties mounted, they prayed all the harder.

Sacrifice for the Sake of the Gospel

The path of obedience was not without cost. Leaving behind family in England, Ken and Bessie came to the U.S. to establish CLC, and from there, the work spread to many countries.

Ken often traveled for weeks or even months at a time, laying foundations for the ministry in new places. Back home, Bessie shouldered the weight of family life, relying on God for strength. "Mother was willing to trust God for wisdom and strength when Dad was gone," Marge remembers. "That trust was central to why they did what they did."

Yet alongside the sacrifice came joy. The family celebrated each answered prayer—funds arriving just in time for a project, new workers joining the team, and most of all, people coming to faith in Jesus.



"They were a great team," Marge says. "Opposite in temperament, but always encouraging each other. Neither of them was highly educated. They just decided it was best to follow their Captain—the Lord Jesus Christ."

Legacy That Still Inspires

Today, decades after those first steps of faith, CLC has grown far beyond what Ken and Bessie could have imagined. "The growth of the work and the many national leaders who are leading CLC in their own countries and internationally would thrill them," Marge says with a smile. And their "why"? It is as relevant as ever. "Yes," Marge insists, "Jesus is worthy of every sacrifice to get the truth of the Gospel to every nation!"



Sidebar: A Family of Prayer

Even as she looks back, Marge continues to look forward—inviting us into prayer:

For CLC: "Pray that the Lord will continue to give godly, humble, visionary leaders—obedient to the Holy Spirit. Seeing God raise up national leaders is thrilling! CLC is a family, and my prayer is that this aspect will continue as we support each other through prayer, finances, and every way possible."

For the Almack Family: Marge and her husband Bill are preparing to move in with their daughter Heidi's family by the end of the year. "They're building a grandparents' addition to their house. This is God's provision for us! Please pray for this transition, as we downsize, pack, and adjust."

The Heart of "Our Why"

Ken and Bessie's lives remind us that the mission of CLC was never built on human strategy alone. It began with two ordinary people who believed that obedience to Christ was worth everything—and who trusted God to use their small steps of faith for His glory.

Their story is, in many ways, the story of CLC itself: prayerful, sacrificial, Christ-centered, and filled with joy at seeing God work. It's why we do what we do, and why the mission continues—until every nation has access to the truth of the Gospel.

Bibles for Young Hearts Update on the CLC Children's Bibles Project

"Let the little children come to me..."

Matthew 19:14

The **CLC Children's Bibles Project** continues to move forward with purpose and faith, bringing God's Word to children who might otherwise never hold a Bible of their own.

What began in a small CLC bookshop in Chiang Mai, Thailand, where I noticed how few children's Bibles were available in Thai, has grown into a global mission to make Scripture accessible, affordable, and age-appropriate for young readers.

The project focuses on countries where Christian resources are scarce and printing options are limited, including Benin, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, India, Ivory Coast, Kenya, Mozambique, Myanmar, Pakistan, Portugal, and Thailand.

The vision is for each CLC country to have three editions of children's Bibles available in its national language: for ages 2–4, 5–8, and 8–11. Each version combines vivid storytelling with engaging illustrations, helping children understand and love God's Word at every stage of their growth.

A major focus of the current phase is the translation and printing of more than 23,000 copies of God's Colorful Kingdom Storybook Bible, a beautifully illustrated



edition originally published by **Tyndale House**.

Designed for children aged 8–11, this Bible features 31 stories that trace the



arc of God's redemptive plan—from creation to Christ's resurrection and beyond. The project includes translations into 14 languages for distribution across 19 countries, including Ukraine, where families are deeply in need of hopefilled Christian materials. CLC Poland is overseeing the Ukrainian translation to ensure children can read and understand these stories in their own heart language.

Together, these efforts form the heart of CLC's wider goal—to print at least 50,000 children's Bibles, and, as the Lord provides, perhaps even 100,000. Each Bible costs around \$4.60 to print and ship, yet its influence stretches far beyond one child.

In many homes, parents and grandparents read alongside their children, turning each Bible into a shared family experience of faith and discovery. One small book often becomes a light that reaches an entire household.

Through this project, CLC continues to see how God uses simple tools—paper, ink, and story—to open hearts and transform lives. See page 23 to donate.

Called to Serve:

The CLC Journey of Liz Patten

When Liz Patten reflects on her journey with CLC International, it's clear that books and Bibles were never just ink and paper to her. They are lifelines—tools God uses to reach hearts and change lives. For more than 30 years, Liz has given herself to this mission. But her story started long before CLC.

A New Testament and a New Life

At 14, Liz received a small New Testament from the Gideons International (now 'Good News for Everyone'). She read it daily, captivated by the truth inside. One verse in particular gripped her: Everyone who calls upon the Name of the LORD shall be saved (Romans 10:13). "Eventually," Liz says, "that was exactly what happened!"

That moment of faith set the course of her life, eventually leading her to say "Yes!" to God's call to missions while at a youth conference in France. Her surrender was deepened during a short-term trip to West Africa and, later, by two years of service in Cameroon with the Full Gospel Mission.

After returning from Cameroon, Liz pursued Portuguese language studies in Coimbra, Portugal, with plans to serve in Angola. It was there that she discovered CLC—not as a concept, but as a living, breathing ministry.

"I was a regular visitor to the CLC bookshop in Avenida Emidio



Navarro," Liz recalls. "My friendship with the missionary couple who ran it grew into a sense that God was directing me to join CLC."

Rita, one of the missionaries, handed Liz copies of *CLC World* magazine and invited her to prayer meetings focused on Angola and Mozambique. Liz's heart stirred. She realized God was weaving together her love for books and her call to Africa with CLC's mission.

A Passion Aligned with a Purpose

Liz had always been a reader. "My mum taught me to read when I was four, and I never looked back," she says. Saturdays were often spent with her dad at the junior library. As a new believer, she devoured Christian books.

So when she sensed God calling her to join CLC, it felt natural. "It was no real surprise that this passion for reading was transformed into a calling to spread the Gospel through literature," she explains. There were challenges, but Liz's conviction was clear: "I wanted to be a missionary."

For Liz, ministry has never been about titles or positions. What drives her daily is "A genuine desire to serve God and to do something with my life that will have an eternal impact." That passion has taken her across continents: two years in Angola, seven in Mozambique, two more in Portugal, and countless visits to CLC ministries in Africa.

Projects like the *Low-Cost Bible Project* for Mozambique, which has distributed over 30,000 Bibles so far, stand as fruit of her faithful service.

But just as important as the projects are the people. "Encouraging my colleagues, many of whom work in very challenging conditions, has been one of my greatest joys," she says.

A Day in the Life

These days, Liz's role looks a little different. Her mornings begin with strong tea, Bible reading, and prayer. Much of her work is now digital—Zoom calls, emails, and WhatsApp messages with colleagues in Mozambique, Sierra Leone, and beyond. She also prepares material for the Prayer Focus calendar and coordinates Global Prayer Days, helping keep the ministry united worldwide.

In between, she takes walks with her adopted terrier, LittleTed—a faithful companion during this season of ministry.

Holding the Baton

As Liz looks towards retirement in the

few next she years, remains as focused on CLC's mission as ever. "We just hold the baton for a while. and then we have to pass it on," she reflects. Her prayer is that new

leaders will rise up, especially in Africa, to carry the vision forward.

And to those considering a similar call? Liz is quick to encourage: "Once you are certain that this is what God wants you to do, just go for it—110%."

Sidebar: How to Pray with Liz

For Liz: Pray that she will remain an encouragement to colleagues right up until retirement and beyond.

For CLC Africa: Pray for strong, godly leaders to step into place so the ministries in Mozambique, Sierra Leone, and throughout the continent can continue to flourish.

For CLC Globally: Pray that our mission remains strong and clear in every nation.

Her "Why"—and Ours

After more than three decades with CLC, Liz sums it up simply: "From the beginning, my 'why' was clear: Jesus is worthy, and His Word must be shared."

Her story, woven into the larger story of CLC, reminds us that the mission is not abstract—it's lived out in the faithfulness of ordinary people, serving an extraordinary God.



Wednesday (28th) - Burkina Faso


