Training time

In 2025, the CLC Digital department continued to fulfil its key role: enabling CLC countries that, due to limited financial and human resources, would otherwise be unable to maintain a web platform for distributing Christian content in their own territory.

Over the past year, our work focused mainly on rebuilding the entire platform, keeping new implementations to a minimum. This allowed the development team, led by Cristi Cotovan, who originally designed our system and is now redesigning it to meet new standards, to make significant progress.

A particularly meaningful highlight was the February training for the Latin American team, exploring platform use and effective search engine positioning to enrich websites with lasting, fruitful content.

Development of the eBook store also continued, improving reading apps for iOS and Android and enabling distribution across national websites. Toward the end of 2025, more mature use of artificial intelligence opened new possibilities to optimise time and resources. Please continue to pray that God will bless these efforts. Our goal is to reach through e-commerce, social media, webinars and messaging everyone seeking Christian resources.

AFRICA

The ministry continued across six countries in 2025, with 11 bookshops serving their communities and beyond.

International Office staff visited Kenya, Mozambique and Sierra Leone, while in May, colleagues from Benin and Côte d'Ivoire were welcomed to France, along with the national director for CLC Canada (Quebec) and other guests, for a conference for French speakers. Key discussions focused on the ongoing challenge of international shipping between France and Africa, and a blessed time of fellowship was enjoyed. Unfortunately, Luc from Burkina Faso was unable to participate due to a visa refusal. Delegates also visited the Evangelical Book Fair in Paris, strengthening relationships with publishers.

The team in Mozambique enjoyed their first staff conference since 2022 and testified to God's blessing on their time together. Sierra Leone had a rocky start to the year, following prolonged staff illness and some staff turnover. Thankfully, new workers came and the work continued.

In Kenya, the ministry expanded through mentoring and publishing African authors, celebrating the ACABA Awards, and progressing towards a permanent headquarters near Nairobi.



In 2025, the ministry in Benin continued to serve faithfully in the midst of significant national challenges. Many customers are facing difficult personal and social circumstances, and we have seen a strong demand for books that focus on prayer and trusting God in times of need. These resources have been especially meaningful, as many people find hope and direction through prayer.

Each working day begins with a time of prayer and reflection, placing the ministry and its activities in God's hands. This rhythm has helped sustain the team and keep the focus on serving with faith and perseverance.

The ministry has faced ongoing challenges, particularly with the transportation of stock, as orders can take several months to arrive from France. We have also continued to navigate difficulties with the tax authorities. Despite these obstacles, we thank God for His help in gradually reducing outstanding debts. Although sales have not yet reached the level needed to fully break even, we have seen a steady increase over time, which encourages us greatly.

While challenges remain, we move forward with hope. We trust that the Lord will continue to provide, strengthen the ministry, and use Christian literature to bring encouragement and answers to prayer as we look ahead to 2026.

During 2025, our work was marked by the solidarity and support of our customers. Some came to comfort us, convinced that CLC was going through difficult times because of the turmoil in our country. Others visited simply to pray for CLC, and some called to encourage us to hold on.

Honestly, the survival of CLC this year was nothing short of the Lord's miraculous support. At the beginning of each month, we would kneel down and declare it a "month of miracles"—and truly, the Lord answered, month after month.

We also thank God for answered prayer for the protection and safety of Luc and his family during these difficult times. Another clear answer to prayer was the provision of a new cash register. We had been without one for more than six months after the old machine failed, and we could not find anyone to repair it.

One of our greatest encouragements was a project to sell second-hand books from CLC France in order to raise funds to purchase Bibles for CLC Burkina Faso.

Our greatest challenge remained keeping the ministry going in the face of a very difficult economic situation, as well as increased competition through social media and book stalls. Through it all, God reminded us that He is the true Owner of this ministry—and that we are His servants, called to depend on Him.

In 2025, the ministry in Ivory Coast was strengthened through fellowship, partnership and God's faithfulness in difficult circumstances. In May, we were blessed to attend the Christian Book Fair in Paris with other francophone CLC countries. It was a valuable opportunity to connect with French publishers and secure Christian resources to serve churches and readers.

Later that month, Martine, together with Marie from CLC Bouake, attended the second CLC Francophone Conference in the south of France. This gathering was a real encouragement, allowing us to share concerns and pray together with colleagues from Canada, Benin, France and the International Office. It was also helpful to discuss the growing challenges around shipping between France and Africa.

Nationally, 2025 was a difficult season, and unrest affected daily life. Even so, we thank God for His protection and provision, as we were able to keep the bookshop open and continue welcoming customers, even when sales were low.

In August, we participated in the AEECI church convention with a book table for four days. It was a joyful time of meeting pastors and believers, sharing resources, and encouraging the Church through Christian literature.

As we look ahead, we continue to trust the Lord as we search for a suitable location in Abidjan for wholesale distribution.

2025 was a year of major developments for the ministry in Kenya, with both challenges and clear signs of God's leading. One of the most encouraging highlights was the growth of the Mama Africa Book Box initiative. In its second year, an online version was introduced to reach children outside Nairobi and even into Uganda. What began as a small additional programme became far more impactful than expected.

Another special development came through an ACABA award-winning author, which led to the launch of a writing class in South Africa. Although no trip had been planned, the Lord opened the way, and three CLC team members travelled there, organised a book festival, and celebrated the graduation of seven new writers.

A difficult turning point came when CLC Kenya's offices were demolished to make way for a government housing project. While painful, this became a catalyst for moving forward with plans for a permanent headquarters. A promise first received in 2017 began to take visible shape in 2025 as preparations for construction progressed. In November, a well was successfully dug on the site with support from CLC colleagues.

We were also encouraged through outreach in Uganda, where 1,000 Picture Bibles were delivered, opening new doors for children's ministry and partnership.

Overall, 2025 was a good year for us. The unrest at the end of 2024 settled down, and life returned more or less to normal. Sales

increased in Beira, but they declined in Maputo and Nampula. All three bookshops worked to strengthen their social media presence and take part in outreach through conferences and other events.

We received two major importations of stock, arriving in February and November. We were also blessed to receive children's Bibles in Portuguese through the Children's Bibles Project initiated by the International Office.

In October, we held a team conference in Maputo and were encouraged by the visit of Liz Patten and Petra Nemansky from the International Office. Our new theme is *Serving Together!* Throughout the year, weekly Zoom meetings helped to strengthen collaboration and keep fellowship strong.

We ran out of our CLC economy Bibles faster than expected, so we began our fourth print run towards the end of the year, bringing the total number of Bibles in this project to 40,000. The Adventist University in Sofala was one of our strongest supporters, purchasing close to 2,000 copies.

We continue to face challenges with the costs and logistics of importing books and Bibles from Brazil and neighbouring South Africa. Through it all, the Lord continues to strengthen our faith and remind us that the ministry belongs to Him.

Although 2025 was not our strongest year for sales, it clearly underlined the faithfulness of God. Sadly, our General Manager, Alfred, was diagnosed with throat cancer and remains on extended sick leave. We also experienced staffing changes early in the year, which placed added pressure on the team. Despite these challenges, God provided new staff, and everyone worked hard to keep the ministry moving forward.

Another major challenge involved one of our rental properties, which required high maintenance and considerable expense. We were also grateful to acquire a new and modern generator, and we thank those who supported us financially for this, especially CLC USA.

The Bo City bookshop continued its outreach ministry using the Kéké (motorised tricycle), attending events and making Bibles and Christian books available to more people.

In March, we welcomed David Scouler and Liz Patten from the International Office, and David returned again in August. We continued weekly Zoom meetings with them, which were a real encouragement. We also valued the CLC Global Days of Prayer, which helped us connect with colleagues worldwide.

CLC remains a trusted supplier of Bibles, Christian books and resources for churches across Sierra Leone. Although we continue to face challenges, especially in keeping materials affordable, we thank God for His provision, and for the faithful support of our partners and local Advisory Board.

INDIA

“Thank You... Thank You”: A Life Touched by God’s Word



A testimony shared by ELS staff:

One evening, a phone call came into our office and was passed through to me. As soon as I answered, I heard a woman weeping. After a moment, she said, again and again, “Sir, thank you... thank you... thank you.” I gently asked what had led her to call.

She explained that she belonged to another religion and had been facing serious family and personal difficulties for some time. Overwhelmed and exhausted, she had reached the point of deciding to end her life.

In that moment of despair, she noticed a book on her shelf—one a friend had given her earlier. She picked it up and opened it at random. As she began to read, she felt as though her own struggles were being described on the page. Then, something unexpected happened: a deep, lasting peace came over her. The anxiety that had been crushing her heart lifted, and the desire to take her own life disappeared.

She turned to the back of the book and found our address and telephone number. That is what led her to call—simply to express her gratitude.

When I asked the title, she told me it was *Streams in the Desert*, Volume One, in Tamil.

By the end of our conversation, her tears had stopped. My own eyes filled with tears of joy as I thanked God. It was a powerful reminder that God is still living and active today and that He continues to use the printed page to bring hope, peace and new life.

SIERRA LEONE

A Gentle Conversation

A testimony from Abdulai Bangura, CLC Freetown:

A lady came into the shop wanting to buy a book that had “nothing about God, Jesus, or anything religious”. We ended up talking for quite some time, and I listened carefully to what she was really looking for.

By the end of our conversation, she chose three books: *Things I Wish I'd Known Before We Got Married*, *Answers to Your Marriage*, and *A Woman After God's Own Heart*. What began as a closed heart turned into openness—simply through patience, kindness and the right resources.

ASIA

In 2025, the Asia Region continued to minister across a wide range of cultural, political and spiritual contexts. It has been a year marked by both challenge and grace, as many countries faced economic pressures, leadership transitions and practical limitations. Yet through it all, we have seen God's faithful provision and guiding hand.

Across the region, CLC ministries remained committed to supporting churches, families and individuals through Christian literature. Bookshops, publishing initiatives, distribution work and trusted partnerships have played a vital role in encouraging evangelism, discipleship and spiritual growth. In several places, steady progress was made through patient relationship-building, clearer communication and shared problem-solving.

This year also brought valuable opportunities for deeper connection among National Directors and leaders. Regular communication, prayer, and gatherings such as the Asia Regional Conference in Bangkok, helped leaders walk together rather than serve in isolation. These moments strengthened trust, unity and a shared sense of calling.

As we reflect on 2025, we thank God for His sustaining grace and for every staff member and volunteer who has served faithfully. Looking ahead, we remain committed to wise stewardship, collaboration and trusting God to lead His work forward.

In 2025, we published 15 new titles including our first publications in Telugu, Malayalam and Kannada. We were encouraged to see a strong response to children's resources: a series of six carry-along Bible Stories (500 copies of each title) sold out within one month. In addition, 2,000 copies of the *Starter Bible*, published earlier in the year with support from Gary Chamberlin, CLC International Director, were sold within ten months. We pray these books will reach many children and help them discover God's truth and love.

We also continued construction work on our faith-project building. Although there have been challenges and limitations, the Lord has faithfully provided strength, resources and encouragement at every stage, allowing the work to move forward in His timing.

We were also thankful to open two new centres, extending our reach into new areas and enabling us to serve more communities with Christian literature and resources.

Finally, after 35 years of service, our National Director, Justin Chellappan, will be retiring from ELS. We are deeply grateful for the privilege of ministry and for God's continued faithfulness, provision and guidance through the years.

In September, we were encouraged to attend the CLC Asia Conference in Bangkok where we enjoyed fellowship with International and Regional Directors, friends and fellow CLC workers. It was a valuable time of prayer, encouragement and mutual strengthening in ministry.

In November, we were also grateful to welcome members of the ELS team from India. During their visit, they explored locally made wooden handicrafts with a vision to supply these to India and potentially develop a long-term partnership. Please pray for wisdom and guidance as this opportunity is considered.

We thank God for our loyal customers who continue to support the ministry. Our main sales remain Bibles, daily devotional books and children's resources. We also continued a close relationship with the Christian Evangelical Church in Minahasa, Manado (North Sulawesi). In partnership with the Children's Ministry Commission, we supported Sunday school ministries by providing teaching materials, children's books and Bibles to help teachers deliver sound biblical teaching to children.

In Surabaya, the distribution of booklets to teenagers and children continued throughout the year. We are thankful for every opportunity God provides, and we trust Him to continue leading the ministry in the year ahead.

In 2025, the ministry in Japan was encouraged through both regional connection and steady local outreach. One of our staff members attended the CLC Asia Conference in September, and we are thankful for this valuable opportunity to reconnect with fellow CLC workers from across the region. The conference provided a refreshing time of fellowship, prayer and mutual learning, strengthening our sense of unity within the wider CLC family. It also renewed our commitment to serve faithfully in our local context while remaining connected to the broader regional vision.

Alongside this, we continued to strengthen communication with our local community through our monthly bookshop newsletter. By God’s grace, the newsletter reached its 60th issue in December 2025—a significant milestone. Each issue shares news of new books, ministry activities, Bible resources and short reflections to encourage readers in their faith. Over the years, the newsletter has become an effective tool for maintaining relationships with customers, churches and supporters as well as for promoting Christian literature and ministry events. Last year began with renewed hope, even as we continued to face severe political, social and economic hardship. The past five years have been marked by uncertainty and fear, and stepping into a new year was not easy for our team. Yet, in the midst of these challenges, we chose to move forward in faith.

Each morning, the staff gathered to pray together, asking the Lord to make us a blessing to others through our lives and through the books entrusted to us. Our desire was to continue serving people by making Christian literature available through our bookshops, even during times of crisis.

In April, we witnessed God’s healing in a personal and encouraging way. Our new bookshop manager in Insein, Ms Lian, was unable to walk properly and was confined to bed for more than two months. By God’s grace, she gradually recovered and is now able to walk comfortably.

Throughout the year, many communities were affected by civil conflict, with people losing homes, church buildings and belongings. Despite these losses, many continued to seek Bibles and Christian books. This encouraged us deeply and reminded us of the importance of providing evangelical literature to strengthen the Church and support evangelism.

We also thank God for increased sales beyond our expectations and for enabling us to reprint key titles despite rising paper costs.

There were both significant challenges and steady progress for the ministry in 2025. Ongoing economic instability—including rising inflation, increased production and import costs, and continued supply chain uncertainty—created ongoing pressure throughout the year. We were encouraged to see continued and growing demand for Christian books, especially Urdu and English Bibles, highlighting the ongoing need for accessible Scripture across the country.

We saw clear answers to prayer and were able to continue the work without interruption. Partnerships with churches, ministry leaders and Christian organisations were strengthened, allowing for more effective distribution, coordination and outreach. One important development was the exploration of local printing solutions. This was pursued to help address rising costs, improve efficiency and strengthen the long-term sustainability of Bible production and distribution.

We are grateful for the continued trust and support of our partners, whose prayers and practical help have been vital in navigating a difficult national environment. Feedback from church leaders and Scripture recipients has encouraged us greatly and reaffirmed our calling. Through the challenges of the year, the team has grown in stewardship, perseverance and dependence on God's guidance. We finish 2025 with renewed commitment and confidence in the Lord's continued leading.

Philippines

2025 was a year of significant change and clear evidence of God's faithfulness in the Philippines ministry. One major transition was the retirement of our former National Director, Romualdo Macinas. In February, we held the formal handover of leadership responsibilities to our new National Director, Deedah Macinas. We thank God for guiding this transition smoothly and for His continued leadership over the work.

Daily devotions remain a vital part of our ministry life, strengthening a culture of dependence on God rather than human strength. We are deeply thankful for each staff member and their faithful service.

We praise God that we met our sales goal this year with the wholesale and online departments contributing the largest portion of sales. At the same time, the Malolos branch faced ongoing challenges as sales declined throughout the year. This remains an area of prayer and focused planning.

Throughout the year, we also held seminars in partnership with a Korean church, conducted city seminars and organised Vacation Bible School seminars at the bookshop. The management team attended the CLC Asia Conference in Bangkok in September, which was an encouraging time of learning and fellowship. Participation in the Manila Book Fair also provided valuable exposure with positive sales results. We give all glory to God and trust Him as we look ahead.

One of the most striking aspects of ministry at CLC Korea was God's continued faithfulness in the midst of challenging circumstances. Despite uncertainty in the publishing environment, many authors approached us with a desire to publish their books. This was a great encouragement, reminding us that God continues to stir hearts to share His message through Christian literature.

One major challenge came when more than 30 years of archived files were lost due to a hardware failure in our NAS system. This unexpected situation caused confusion and concern as many manuscripts and production materials were affected. Yet, by God's grace, the team did not give up. We focused on moving forward step by step, publishing delayed manuscripts and reorganising our workflows.

We are especially thankful for the patience and understanding shown by authors and translators whose publication schedules were impacted. Their willingness to wait and continue partnering with us were meaningful testimonies of trust.

One of the greatest encouragements of the year was celebrating the 50th anniversary of CLC Korea. As we look ahead, we pray the Lord will continue to use CLC Korea to strengthen His Church through Christian literature.

In 2025, we continued serving churches, families and individuals by providing access to Christian literature and supporting spiritual growth through focused outreach. Throughout the year, the ministry sought to follow God's leading while adapting to changing needs and ministry opportunities.

The year began with a key milestone in January when CLC Thailand launched its first children's Bibles on National Children's Day. In February, a promotion offering a 30% discount on children's books helped increase distribution and introduced Christian resources to new readers.

From April onwards, we prepared for and launched a youth-focused programme with an emphasis on digital engagement. Targeted Facebook promotions helped us reach younger audiences, and many initial contacts developed into meaningful conversations through personal follow up.

In September, we hosted an event in Chiang Mai to introduce CLC and its ministry vision to Chinese communities. The final quarter included preparations for an Israel Seminar and Christmas promotions.

During the Christmas season, books were shared as gifts, providing opportunities to communicate hope and the love of Christ. Despite challenges, such as a quieter market and operational delays, 2025 brought increased awareness of CLC in Thailand and strengthened our reliance on prayer and trust in God's timing.

EUROPE & CENTRAL ASIA

2025 was marked by both significant challenges and joyful moments, as we worked across many different languages, cultures and even currencies!

In March, in Krakow, we experienced rich fellowship with our publishing teams from various countries, as well as with our publishing partners from the UK and the USA. These meetings strengthened relationships and encouraged collaboration across ministries.

In May, the CLC Francophone Conference was held in the south of France. Prior to this, participants had the opportunity to visit the French Evangelical Book Fair in Paris, where colleagues from Benin, Canada and Ivory Coast were able to place orders for new products.

In September, we hosted the CLC European Conference, and the visiting teams were invited to our warehouse in Montélimar - another valuable opportunity for fellowship.

During the year, I was also able to visit CLC in Central Asia. This context requires much discernment, and great care must be taken with every decision.

As we enter 2026, we pray for God's presence and guidance in everything we do.

2025 was not an easy year, as we faced challenges, but we also saw God's faithfulness carry us through.

One of the biggest developments for the ministry was the introduction of a new stock management system. This was a significant step for us and brought major changes to the way we operate. We are thankful that it has improved efficiency and helped save time and effort, allowing our team to serve more effectively.

Towards the end of the year, the country entered a season of major change as Bulgaria prepared to join the euro zone on 1 January 2026. December 2025 was the key month for this transition. November and December were also marked by large public protests, as many people called for justice and accountability. In the midst of uncertainty, we continued serving faithfully and praying for peace, wisdom and a better future for our nation.

We were especially encouraged to publish three new books this year: *Tramp for the Lord* by Corrie ten Boom, and two children's Bibles—*The Bible Story Book for Starters* and *Picture Bible for the Little Ones*. We give thanks to God for these resources and pray they will help readers of all ages grow in faith.

Central Asia (CA1)

2025 was a difficult and uncertain year for our ministry due to several major changes. After legislative updates at the end of 2024, we were forced to stop our apartment rental work through Airbnb, which had supported the ministry financially. We then decided to lease part of our bookshop premises for commercial use, and the first tenant agreed to renovate the space at their own expense. Sadly, during the renovation a hot water pipe burst, causing damage to the premises and to some of our books. The tenant's business did not succeed, and he left after two months.

In April, new tenants were found, and after further renovation we were able to reopen the store in mid-May. However, those tenants also left after four months,

and by September we were again searching for someone new. We thank God that new tenants were found fairly quickly and are still operating.

During the year, new restrictions on the sale of Christian literature greatly limited our ability to operate and created ongoing stress and uncertainty. Similar organisations now function quietly and only by appointment. The availability of free literature in the country also affects sales.

Despite these pressures, we continue to pray, trust the Lord and seek His wisdom for every decision as we serve faithfully.

Central Asia (CA2)

2025 was a very encouraging year for the ministry, and we have seen the Lord's hand at work in many ways. Early in the year, a local school visited and selected boxes of children's books to expand their library. It was a joyful reminder of how Christian literature can shape young lives.

During the summer, the National Director and her family were away for three months, and our local store director ran the shop independently for the first time. She did an excellent job, including finding a new front sales assistant. After much prayer, the Lord provided a new staff member who is a young believer. Although she is still learning, her joy in Christ has been a real blessing to the team and customers.

Many people have hoped we could open more bookshops, and while that has not been possible, God has opened new doors. We formed partnerships with two local bookshops that now sell our books and Bibles on consignment, and we began selling through two widely used e-commerce platforms. As a result, our resources are now available in ten physical locations across the metro area, as well as online. We give God all the praise.

Sharing the Gospel Beyond the Bookshop

One of our customers has a wonderful heart for outreach. She regularly takes Christian books into a village in an area that was recently affected by tension near the border. Praise God, there is peace now, and the community is slowly rebuilding.

During one visit, she organised a women's meeting with the simple desire to gather people together and share the gospel. Thirteen women came, and she shared with joy that one of them received Jesus as her Lord.

We thank God for faithful believers like this who carry the message of Christ beyond the bookshop, using Christian literature and personal witness to bring hope into their communities.

In 2025, we were encouraged to see a noticeable increase in Bible sales, confirmed through recent stock-taking. This rise suggests a renewed hunger for God's Word during a season of uncertainty and rapid social change. Churches have purchased Bibles for outreach, while others have bought them as gifts or for personal reading. We thank the Lord for this encouragement and ask for prayer, trusting that God is working deeply in ways we may not yet see.

Cyprus' location near areas of conflict has also meant that refugees continue to arrive seeking safety and hope. Christians from various churches have been reaching out to them with practical care and spiritual support, including the gift of Bibles. Many believers have come to CLC to obtain Scriptures in different languages so that refugees can read and find direction through faith in the Lord Jesus.

The summer also brought serious challenges through destructive forest fires that threatened lives and villages. In one church, a Christian firefighter shared about his experience on the front lines. Afterwards, a CLC customer was moved to provide him with Bibles from our bookshop to distribute to affected villagers—offering comfort and hope in the Lord, who strengthens His people in times of trial.

Eastern Europe 1 (EE1)

Our motto for 2025 was: "We walk by faith, not by sight." Day by day, God continues to care for our nation, and the bookshop has remained open despite the difficult situation around us. We are the only physical Christian bookshop in our country that is not located inside a church building, and we count it a privilege to keep serving.

It is a joy to support people who are taking their first steps in following Jesus. One day, a man who had repented while in prison visited the bookshop and shared his story with us. Later, he returned to buy a children's Bible for his young daughter who was seriously ill with cancer. We were able to pray for her, and we continue trusting the Lord for His comfort and healing.

Throughout the year, we worked with very limited financial resources. In April, when it was time to pay taxes, we did not have enough funds. We prayed, and God provided through a customer, allowing us to meet this need.

At the end of 2025, we printed 5,000 calendars for free distribution, which were widely used during Christmas evangelistic meetings.

Hungary: *Truth That Set Her Free*

A customer ordered our book *Telling Yourself the Truth* a few months ago. As she began reading, she became deeply engaged with the message—especially the way it helps people recognise and challenge wrong beliefs behind depression, anxiety, frustration and fear.

After finishing the book, she didn't keep it to herself. Instead, she ordered six more copies and started a small study group with friends so they could read and learn together. She also joined our online course on Christian self-esteem, where the book is a key module.

This testimony encouraged us greatly. One book can spark real change and strengthen faith.

2025 was a blessed and challenging year for us, and we are grateful for the Lord's help throughout it. God blessed the ministry with strong sales in our store and through an online marketplace. We were encouraged to see Bibles being ordered from across the country—from large cities to small villages—and even from neighbouring nations. By His grace, we covered our expenses and saved enough to print 1,000 large-print Bibles.

We also attended several conferences with book tables. These events were a great blessing, helping us share about the ministry, meet new people and distribute many Christian resources to those who needed them.

A small but meaningful highlight came in the summer when our front door finally broke after years of struggling with it. The Lord provided the means to install a new door, which brought real joy to the team.

Another challenge came when our director stepped down in August. We were concerned, but God provided support through a Christian brother who helped us with legal matters during this transition. We are also grateful that the Lord provided the right person to step into the role of director. We thank God for His care and trust Him to guide us in the next steps.

Through everything, we have felt the Lord's protection and leading.

In 2025, we thank God for His faithfulness as the CLC ministry in France continued to grow, adapt and serve readers across the country. One significant development was the launch of a new magazine, *Itineraries*, created to highlight books that guide readers towards Christ and encourage deeper spiritual reflection.

Throughout the year, we took important steps towards renewing our bookshops, defining a long-term renovation and rebranding strategy to be rolled out in 2026. In publishing, we were grateful to acquire LLB Publications, the French publishing arm of Scripture Union International, and to integrate both LLB and Olivétan into our regular workflow. A total of 24 new titles were published, including *Amazing Grace*, the biography of John Newton, which received a strong response, and *Pornotoxine*, launched with a public author event in Paris.

A special encouragement was the way God enabled us to work together for the mission, even in the face of spiritual opposition. The sale of second-hand books in our shops became a real support to the work in Burkina Faso, enabling Luc, the National Director of CLC Burkina Faso, to receive Bibles free of charge throughout 2025.

The year also marked a season of transition, as we thanked God for the faithful service of long-standing staff and welcomed new team members. Despite economic pressures, the Lord sustained the ministry, and we move forward with gratitude, unity and trust in Him.

Germany

Our days are filled with a diverse range of customers who come into the shop, each with their own unique needs. We serve thousands of people of all ages and backgrounds, including refugees from Ukraine and Syria, customers originally from Spanish speaking countries and immigrants from Ghana. Some of these people now have children with German citizenship. We also have a notable number of LGBTQ customers. We have observed that many Christians with LGBTQ backgrounds find it easier to visit our Christian bookshop than to attend a church.

As well as the daily work in the bookshop, we organise book tables at various locations, host book readings and manage a significant volume of daily mail orders submitted through our website.

We have built many strong connections in the community and have customers that encourage us to continue our local services. Some have also expressed concern about the possible closure of our shop, especially as many other stores in Hamburg are closing down.

We are thankful to the Lord who is the one who gives us all we need to persevere and continue serving our vibrant community in this city.

In 2025, we were encouraged to see growth in the ministry in Hungary—both in and beyond our bookshops, and through our website. We took part in even more book table events than the year before, and the Lord opened many opportunities to serve Baptist, Free Christian, Pentecostal and Reformed churches. Some of these were new contacts, and we were grateful to make Christian books and resources available to new congregations. At times, preparations were challenging because invitations came at the last minute, but God helped us with everything needed. At one event, we were also asked to lead a short workshop on how we see ourselves and how God sees us.

We were thankful for new support within the team. Eszter Kárpáti joined the Budapest bookshop part-time, helping with marketing through Facebook and Instagram, as well as daily bookshop tasks. Zoltán Vincze (from Miskolc) also helped by taking on some website maintenance.

During the year, we introduced new gift items, including magnetic bookmarks and small cards, which were well received. Toward the end of the year, changes in the wider publishing environment affected Christmas sales and encouraged us to focus more intentionally on online outreach. We thank the Lord for sustaining the ministry and guiding us forward.

In 2025, CLC Italy experienced transitions, answered prayers and meaningful ministry moments across the country. We are grateful for how God provided the right people and opportunities at the right time.

Several leadership changes took place in our bookshops. In Catania, Andrea joined as manager in April, bringing a deep love for reading and a strong grounding in biblical theology. In Milan, Giulia, a former intern, began training in August, contributing skills in marketing, communication and publishing. In Naples, after more than twenty years of service, the bookshop manager stepped into full-time pastoral ministry. His successor, Nadia, brings experience from journalism and bookshop work, and we see her arrival as a clear answer to prayer.

Eastern Europe 2

Freedom Through the Power of God's Word

A customer shared a powerful story of how the book of Acts spoke directly into his life. For a long time, he had been interested in esotericism and horoscopes, and he owned many books connected to the occult.

One day, while attending a local church, he read Acts 19—the passage where people publicly burn their magic scrolls after turning to Christ. As he read, he felt deeply convicted and decided he needed to do the same. He went home, gathered all of his occult books, and took them outside to burn them.

He told us that the books did not catch fire at first, and for a long time nothing seemed to happen. But when they finally began to burn, he suddenly started shaking so strongly that he fell into the snow and lay there for some time.

When he was finally able to stand again, he saw that the books were almost completely burned. He said that in that moment he felt light, as if a heavy burden had been lifted from him.

United Kingdom

Remembering Paul Bailey

The passing of our dear colleague Paul Bailey after a short illness deeply affected the whole team. With no close family, the CLC warehouse team became his family—visiting him in hospital and later attending his funeral. Nine colleagues gathered at his bedside as he entered the Lord's presence. As a hospital chaplain prayed, a visible peace came over Paul, touching everyone present. In the days that followed, many shared stories of his quiet generosity, steady faith and unflinching cheerfulness—a legacy that continues to inspire us.

We are very grateful to the Lord for our ministry during 2025. Online sales increased, while bookshop sales in Katowice remained stable. We were also encouraged to see growth in our publications, with sales rising by around 20%.

At the beginning of the year, our plan was to publish ten titles—an ambitious goal for our small publishing department. By God's grace, we were able to publish *The Starter Bible* for children, as well as several titles for adults by A. W. Tozer, Roy Hession, Timothy Cross and Dietrich Bonhoeffer. For the first time, we also published books in cooperation with CLC Italy and CLC Portugal, including titles by Augustine and Lottie Moon from B&H Kids. Two titles by national authors were delayed and are now planned for 2026. Although we published these books, most print runs are now smaller than in previous years.

During the summer, Eva was able to attend several youth camps with book tables, which provided valuable opportunities for sales and new contacts.

At the end of 2025, CLC Poland merged with the Credo Foundation (a publisher), which includes taking on the translation of several important titles. This brings both opportunity and challenge for the publishing work ahead.

As Eva, our National Director in Katowice, plans to retire within two years, we are praying for the right person to step into leadership and continue guiding the ministry faithfully.

Portugal

In 2025, CLC Portugal served both locally and internationally through partnership, prayer, and generosity. We participated in key European gatherings, including the ECPA Rights Fair and CLC Publishing Training in Kraków in March, and the CLC European Conference in France in September. These moments strengthened relationships, sharpened vision and encouraged collaboration across borders.

A significant highlight of the year was the close partnership with CLC Mozambique. Through regular Zoom meetings and with support from the International Office, we worked together to strengthen the ministry there, helping to provide children’s Bibles and Christian books free of charge. In addition, hundreds of Bibles were sent as gifts to ministries across Africa, supporting evangelism and discipleship in many contexts.

We also had opportunities to serve through teaching and testimony, sharing devotionals at the CLC Europe Conference, and via online meetings with teams in Ecuador and Peru.

The year brought challenges, particularly as the team was reduced to one full-time staff member by November. Yet God also fulfilled a long-held dream: the sale of publishing rights for a bestselling Portuguese title, now translated and released in the USA and Canada. We thank God for His faithfulness and look ahead with hope.

Romania

In 2025, the Lord helped us to continue the work through a very difficult season. We praise God that our staffing situation became more stable this year, which brought real encouragement and helped us serve more consistently.

By God’s grace, we were also able to publish several new books, and we are thankful that the titles from our publishing house are still being read and purchased. Another answer to prayer was being able to buy the new computers we needed, as our old equipment was no longer compatible with the programmes required for our work.

The year was challenging for many people across the country, as rising living costs placed heavy pressure on families. For many, even basic daily needs became harder to meet, and books became more difficult to afford. In moments like this, it is easy to feel that resources are running out and that hope is fading.

Through it all, the Lord reminded us that even with careful planning, effort and sacrifice, many outcomes remain beyond our control. Our responsibility is to do our best—and to trust God for His help and provision.

We value every day God allows us to continue the ministry. Times remain unpredictable, but we trust the Lord to guide us with wisdom and faithfulness.

Switzerland

2025 was a challenging yet faith-building year for the CLC ministry in Switzerland. Ongoing uncertainty around our premises continued to test our resilience, but we thank God that He enabled us to remain open and continue serving customers through distribution across the country. This season has encouraged us to seek the Lord daily and trust Him in situations that remain unresolved, while

learning patience, perseverance and deeper dependence on Him.

Although we do not have a physical bookshop and therefore receive limited direct feedback, we continue to see how God uses Christian literature in quiet but meaningful ways. One customer shared how *Coffee with Father God* deeply encouraged her, leading her to buy extra copies for friends. Later, we discovered the children's edition of the same book and chose it for our own daughter, opening new opportunities to help her engage with God's Word.

During the year, we were also unexpectedly able to support CLC Italy during a demanding transition period. What had been planned as rest became a time of service.

Despite personal health challenges and times of loss, we remain confident that God is at work and look ahead with hope for growth and new opportunities.

United Kingdom

We are grateful to the Lord for the many opportunities we have had to distribute Bibles and Christian literature across the UK—and beyond.

The growth of our wholesale work has helped make several initiatives possible, including one of the boldest developments of the year: *ReBible*. This project is a response to the "Quiet Revival"—a renewed interest in Christian spirituality, especially among 18 to 30-year-olds. Our ambition is to distribute one million Bibles at just £1 each.

We were delighted to open our second bookshop, based at the Eastbourne offices in a wonderful setting by the marina, where many people pass by each day.

During 2025, we continued hosting two key conferences: *Mission Worship* and the *Hand in Hand* children's workers conference. The latter grew significantly this year after moving to a larger venue. We also served at more conferences with book tables, which helped strengthen relationships with church groups and ministries.

Our print-on-demand operation continues to grow, and we expanded capacity to produce a wider range of resources.

We also remember with sadness our dear colleague Paul Bailey, who died after a short illness. His loss affected our whole team deeply.

We thank God that our finances improved after difficult years, enabling us to support CLC work in more than ten countries.

EASTERN EUROPE 1

A Place of Peace

We are often encouraged by customers who do not regularly attend church services—many of them are not yet Christians. Still, they often tell us that when they come into the CLC bookshop, they feel a special sense of comfort and peace. We believe this is because the Holy Spirit is present and at work through this ministry.

One elderly woman visited the bookshop and shared some of the pain she was carrying. Her daughter struggled with alcoholism, and as a grandmother she was raising her granddaughter on her own. After her first visit, she returned again and again, saying that the bookshop had become a place where she could find quiet, peace and support.

During this time, her granddaughter sadly passed away. In her grief, the woman remembered words she had read in the bookshop from 1 Corinthians 13:7: “Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.” Those words stayed with her and led her to think deeply about what real love truly is—and who the Source of that love might be.

Even when people do not yet know Christ, God can meet them gently through a safe space, a kind conversation, and a verse of Scripture at the right moment.

ROMANIA

A Bookshop Visit That Changed Everything

A young student shared how he struggled for two years with depression while studying at a high-pressure school. He explained that the pressure was not only academic—he also tried to live a “perfect” Christian life, shaped by unrealistic expectations. Instead of joy, his faith became heavy and painful.

Quietly, without telling anyone, he reached the point where he almost gave up on Christianity altogether. But his school was close to the CLC bookshop, and he began stopping by after classes to read and look for answers.

One day, he picked up *The Christian Compass* by Les Wheeldon. The title immediately caught his attention, and he thought, “This is exactly what I need.” As he read, something shifted inside him. He said the despair began to lift, and when he left the bookshop, life seemed full of colour again.

He later shared that God used that book to remind him: Scripture and Christian books are like maps, but the Holy Spirit is the true “compass” who guides us into truth and helps us find the right direction.

LATIN AMERICA

CLC Latin America spans eight countries: Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Mexico, Panama, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela. In all of these, CLC is faithfully sharing Christian literature and seeing significant spiritual fruit across the region, by God's grace.

The past year has brought encouraging growth. CLC Venezuela experienced its strongest year in a decade. We thank God for the remarkable opportunity opened up for them through HarperCollins, whose generous donation of Bibles, along with support from CLC Colombia, has strengthened the ministry's impact.

Almost all our countries in the region reported increased sales. Please pray especially for Peru, where we are navigating personnel changes and working to strengthen our sales capacity.

We rejoice that CLC Colombia acquired two new premises, in Barranquilla and Bucaramanga, while Panama successfully relocated two bookshops within Panama City. By God's grace, Mexico also saw remarkable growth in sales.


This year's Regional Leaders' Meeting in Panama brought rich fellowship and encouragement for all who took part.

CLC Chile continues to serve the nation through our bookshops in Antofagasta and Temuco as well as through online sales that help us reach communities across the country. In 2025, we were especially grateful for the growth in our distribution. By God's grace, it exceeded all expectations and became the highest distribution year in our history.

In March, we held our annual conference. More than a members' meeting, this gathering is a spiritual retreat and a valuable time of fellowship, prayer and encouragement. We were blessed to welcome leaders from across the region, including representatives from CLC Ecuador and CLC Peru as well as our Regional Director and his wife. A new board was also elected, helping to strengthen and guide the ministry for the years ahead.

A major highlight of 2025 was celebrating the 65th anniversary of the Santiago bookshop, our main distribution centre. We held a special thanksgiving service and welcomed pastors, seminary leaders and faithful supporters to honour God's work through the ministry. Throughout the year, we also participated in events with youth, women and pastors, hosted our first livestream apologetics workshop, and continued a weekly radio segment on Radio Armonía, sharing book recommendations, reflections and messages of hope.

Last year, 2025, was a year of blessing and growth for the ministry in Colombia, marked by God's grace and faithfulness. One significant step forward was the purchase of two premises in Barranquilla and Bucaramanga. This has strengthened the stability of the ministry and helped us finish the year encouraged and able to meet our commitments.

We also made improvements to support the work more effectively, including updating key equipment that helped our team serve more efficiently in day-to-day ministry. Throughout the year, we continued participating in book tables in many locations, extending the reach of Christian literature and strengthening relationships with churches, customers and wholesale partners.

A special highlight was the refurbishment of the Barranquilla bookshop. The improvements included better space for displaying resources and parking for customers, creating a more welcoming environment.

Alongside these developments, we also focused on the spiritual growth of our staff. With guidance from Pastor Andrew Pak, the team participated in weekly discipleship, helping strengthen the ministry not only in practical service but also in faith, unity and Christ-centred purpose. We give thanks to the Lord for His ongoing provision and for allowing the ministry to continue growing in every area.

Ecuador

We were thankful to continue strengthening the church in Ecuador through Bible training and Christian literature. During the year, 703 people took part in biblical training through seminars, such as *History of Redemption III*, the *Inductive Study Bible* training, and the *Thompson Seminar*.

In September, we participated in the Guayaquil International Book Fair. We were able to serve many schools and individuals who do not yet know Christ, freely sharing the gospel through literature and meaningful conversations.

Throughout the year, we also held book tables and travelled with the mobile bookshop to different cities and remote communities.

We were able to donate Christian literature to churches with limited resources, including Bibles, tracts and evangelistic books. We also gave donations to a public hospital, including children's books, resources offering encouragement and support, and literature to individuals facing addiction.

In November, we organised the National Bookshops Event, featuring new and Christmas resources, and offering training on study Bibles and the use of artificial intelligence. A major answer to prayer was the purchase of a new property for CLC in Quito, providing space for the bookshop, distribution, offices, parking, and even a café and reading room.

In 2025, the ministry in Mexico was marked by growth and hard work. We give thanks to the Lord for providing what was needed throughout the year. We were encouraged to strengthen relationships with international suppliers, serve new customers and continue supporting those the Lord has enabled us to serve consistently.

During the year, we took part in important events that helped raise awareness of the ministry in churches, seminaries and within the wider community. These opportunities allowed us to share the vision of CLC and connect with new people who are seeking Christian resources.

A significant step forward was the beginning of improvements to our facilities, made possible through support from the International Office. Work included replacing the flooring in the warehouse and distribution area (260 square metres), installing a new main entrance door and continuing to improve the space overall.

One of our greatest challenges was managing these renovations while sales and daily responsibilities increased. We also continue to pray for the Lord to provide suitable staff with the heart and skills needed for ministry. Despite wider economic and political pressures in the country, we remain grateful to God for strengthening the team and stable relationships with customers and suppliers. God has been good to us.

Panama

There was major change and renewed faith for CLC Panama in 2025. One of the biggest milestones was refreshing the ministry's image through the relocation and refurbishment of our two main bookshops: Vista Hermosa and Albrook Mall. After losing our previous premises at the end of 2024, this transition felt like a serious challenge. Yet, God answered our prayers and helped us move forward successfully. We are grateful that the new look and updated spaces have been warmly received by customers.

On a national level, we were thankful to take part in the Teletón 20 - 30 (prominent telethon event). This was an important opportunity to serve and stand alongside initiatives that support children in Panama, and it helped raise awareness of CLC's presence and purpose.

We were also greatly encouraged by the visit of the International Office and regional leaders as we hosted the CLC Latin America regional meeting.

We are grateful that CLC Panama is more than a chain of bookshops - it is a bridge between the heart of God and the nation, offering resources that help transform lives. We finished the year with deep gratitude and a renewed desire to serve with clear vision and wholehearted commitment.

Peru

In 2025, we had opportunities to advance the ministry's mission. One of the main blessings was the strengthening of relationships with churches, schools, Bible institutes, and evangelistic ministries, where the response to Christian resources was very positive. Through these partnerships, we were able to distribute children's Bibles and books, especially through ministries serving vulnerable communities with high needs, many of them outside the capital city.

Throughout the year, many people visited the bookshop to share testimonies of gratitude, recognising that God had used a book to bring comfort, direction, hope or opportunities to share the gospel. We saw how a timely recommendation can become a simple but powerful tool in the Lord's hands.

We were able to reduce debt with suppliers and strengthen relationships with them. Donations received felt like God's "manna," helping maintain enough stock to continue distributing Bibles and resources.



In our Huánuco bookshop, the team prayed for increased distribution and extended opening hours to Saturdays and Sundays. By God's grace, this helped reach the target they had set.

Nationally, the team held devotions online and were encouraged by a visit from Carlos Cunha (CLC Portugal). Although Peru faced social and security challenges, and a change in president, the Lord taught us to depend on His provision beyond what we can see.

Looking back on 2025, we are deeply grateful for the Lord for the team He is building in CLC Uruguay. Finding staff with a heart for ministry and a long-term vision continues to be a challenge, but God provided in a wonderful way

this year by bringing a sister from Argentina to support our work on social media. She has served excellently, helping us focus on sharing content that builds people up spiritually and not simply promoting sales. The response and encouragement from believers have been very positive.

We also thank God for growth in distribution, which increased by 12% compared with the previous year. WhatsApp has been especially helpful as many customers now place orders through this channel, and demand has been strong. We are also thankful for every person who visited the bookshop as footfall increased significantly during the year.

Through this season, the Lord has reminded us that our trust must be completely in Him. We have seen His hand day by day, providing the stock needed for distribution and enabling us to remain free of debt to publishers - a real reason for gratitude.

As we look ahead to 2026, one key challenge will be changing our sales and accounting system. Please pray that God will give us wisdom and clarity as we take this important step, and that the ministry will continue to grow in faithfulness and impact.

We witnessed the Lord sustaining and strengthening CLC Venezuela in the midst of the ongoing crisis in our country. Despite many difficulties, we experienced our strongest year in more than a decade. We thank God that this allowed us to improve staff support and continue meeting the requirements and pressures that organisations face nationally.

A major blessing came through a generous donation from HarperCollins, which enabled us to offer Bibles at affordable prices. This opened doors for God's Word to reach new homes and hearts, including many people who previously could not afford a Bible.

We were also encouraged to see an increase in new customers. In our Valencia bookshop, the number of daily customers almost doubled compared with previous years. Alongside this, the Lord helped us expand into new ways of reaching people. We began selling through Mercado Libre and strengthened our presence on social media, especially Instagram.

By God's grace, we were also able to support pastors and leaders in at least four different areas of the country where access to Bibles is limited. We donated Bibles to children with few resources, shared women's books with women in prison and provided special Bibles to pastors in need.

Through every challenge, we remain grateful that the Lord continues to use CLC Venezuela to spread hope, strengthen the Church and make His Word accessible.

MEXICO

Serving Beyond the Shelves

On November 6th, a young man named Eduardo fell from a vehicle right outside our bookshop in Mexico City. One of our team members was outside receiving a delivery and was the first to reach him and help.

Sadly, no ambulance or medical service wanted to assist at first, thinking he was drunk or on drugs. However, we soon realised he was

a Guatemalan migrant from an Indigenous community. He had no one in Mexico to help him, and his family spoke very little Spanish. We managed to contact them and understand that he was completely alone.

We took Eduardo to the hospital in the CLC van. From that moment on, we stayed involved—checking on him, updating his family every day and doing whatever we could. God even provided an interpreter who spoke Maya K'iche', which made communication much easier. We also contacted the Guatemalan Consulate for support.

Eduardo spent two weeks in intensive care, and his condition was very serious. Doctors warned that he might not survive, but churches, friends and the wider CLC community prayed together. On November 27th, Eduardo woke up, and, on December 3rd, he was discharged from the hospital. Praise God!

We cared for him for another two weeks, shared God's Word with him, and the Lord provided everything we needed. With the Consulate's help, he was able to return home safely on December 15th.

This experience brought our team together and reminded us why the ministry matters: not only to share Christian resources but to show the love of Christ in real life.

PANAMA

A Father's Return to Faith

While helping a young father choose Bible storybooks for his five-year-old son, a CLC worker sensed something deeper unfolding. As they spoke about teaching children God's Word, the young man broke down in tears. He shared that he had once been raised in the Gospel and even served as a youth leader, but painful experiences had led him away from faith and into addiction. After spending four years in prison, he was now seeking the Lord again. Determined to raise his son differently, he expressed deep gratitude for CLC and the resources that help restore lives and faith.

NORTH AMERICA & THE CARIBBEAN

As we reflect on 2025 across North America and the Caribbean, we do so with deep gratitude for God's faithfulness in a year shaped by both challenge and opportunity. Economic pressures, rising costs and social uncertainty have touched many of the communities we serve, yet we praise God that there remains a strong hunger for His Word.

Isaiah 55:11 reminds us: *"So also is my word. I send it out, and it always produces fruit."* Throughout the region, we have seen this promise fulfilled in quiet yet powerful ways. In the USA and Canada, pastors, churches and ministry leaders were equipped through the distribution of thousands of Bibles and Christian books in English, French and many other languages.

Across the Caribbean, our teams continued to serve with perseverance and compassion. In Antigua, the bookshop remains a place of prayer and encouragement. In Dominica, ministry carried on despite limited resources. Barbados continues as a steady witness, while Trinidad and Tobago shines Gospel light through their bookshops.

Each nation is unique, yet God's Word is bearing fruit everywhere it is sent.

2025 was a year of continued witness and faithfulness for CLC Antigua and Barbuda in the midst of a difficult economic climate. Rising costs of living created pressure for individuals, churches and the bookshop, yet the Lord continued to sustain the ministry and open doors to serve.

One of the most significant moments of the year took place on September 9th, when churches across Antigua united for a nationwide day of prayer and fasting, lifting up the government and the nation before the Lord. We were encouraged by the unity of God’s people and thankful for His presence as believers declared together that Antigua and Barbuda belong to the Lord. CLC was honoured to participate by distributing gospel pamphlets and sharing messages of hope and truth within the community.


Throughout the year, the CLC bookshop continued to serve as a spiritual lighthouse in the nation. Even during economic hardship, people regularly visited seeking prayer, encouragement and Christian resources. Many testified that others recommended CLC when searching for spiritual help, which has been a meaningful confirmation of the ministry’s impact and trust within the community.

Although the economy remains challenging, we have been reminded that the need for God’s Word does not decrease in difficult times—it often increases. We remain committed to serving faithfully and trusting the Lord to continue using this ministry to bring light, hope and truth to Antigua and Barbuda.

Barbados

By God’s grace, we came through a challenging year in Barbados. Although the national economy continues to struggle, the Lord has shown His faithfulness by enabling us to keep serving His people through Christian literature and resources.



While sales were lower than we had hoped, we remain thankful for every Bible and Christian book purchased, and for the way God continues to use these resources to encourage believers.

We are also grateful for financial gifts from different CLC fields, which helped us meet essential costs and remain operational throughout the year.

A highlight of 2025 was the visit in November from our International Director, Gary Chamberlin, accompanied by Regional Director Jim Pitman. Their time with us was a real encouragement and strengthened our sense of connection within the wider CLC family.

Our board met twice during the year and continues working to strengthen the ministry and plan wisely for the future. Please pray with us as we explore the possibility of selling a piece of land, which would help provide greater stability going forward.

We also continue to ask for prayer for Marion Manning’s health, and we thank God for His provision and care for her throughout the year.

One significant challenge was the lack of capital for new stock purchases, especially our limited ability to order a large quantity of *Our Daily Bread 2026*. Despite this, we are grateful the Lord opened a way for us to still supply some copies to customers who needed them.

Canada

In 2025, we gave thanks to God for His faithfulness in sustaining the ministry in Canada. Despite periods of staff unavailability, the Lord helped our team remain resilient and continue serving with perseverance. We were also able to fill key vacant positions, and we continue to pray that God will send workers with a missionary heart, strong character and the skills needed to serve well.

One of the most encouraging moments of the year was welcoming Kathy back to the team after a serious health challenge. Following treatment and much prayer support after being diagnosed with a brain tumour, we praise God that she has regained strength and is now able to serve again.

A major operational highlight was the successful optimisation of our distribution warehouse, resulting in increased capacity and faster processing times.

During the summer, we saw God use books to strengthen His people through key events. Our annual warehouse sale helped pastors, church workers and theology students access vital resources at reduced prices. The Montreal Christian Book and Arts Fair also enabled new authors and Christian artisans to connect with fresh audiences.

We also strengthened partnerships with theological faculties and churches, including supplying eight libraries for Reformed and Baptist faculties in Quebec and Haiti. Looking ahead, we ask for prayer for a smooth transition as we launch a new technology system to strengthen our operations.

Dominica

2025 was a year marked by God's grace and mercy in the midst of many challenges in Dominica. Slow sales, family pressures and ongoing political disturbance often weighed heavily, yet the Lord proved to be a place of rest and daily strength. Although the work may appear to be carried by one person, we are reminded that this ministry belongs to the Lord, and His Holy Spirit continues to provide what is needed day by day.

During the year, it was discouraging to see a decline in interest in Christian literature among some local assemblies. Even so, we were reminded that we must give in order to receive. Bibles and Christian books were donated to those in need, as well as to several schools and churches. In 2025, many customers expressed gratitude and praise for the encouragement, prayers and ministry in word, deed, literature and Christian resources. In a nation facing limited employment opportunities and weakened Christian community life, the continued work of the ministry is a testimony to God's sustaining power.

Despite the difficulties around us, we continue serving because many on the island still need to hear the message of Jesus Christ and grow in faith. Making Christian literature accessible remains vital for evangelism and discipleship.

In November, we were informed that rent will increase by more than 50%. Please pray with us as we seek a new, affordable location so the ministry can continue sustainably.

Trinidad & Tobago

2025 was truly a year of learning to live by faith for the ministry in Trinidad and Tobago. We entered the year facing serious financial pressure.

In December 2024, we received notice to vacate our Tobago premises due to significant rent arrears. Through prayer, perseverance and ongoing communication with the landlord, we were granted time to work towards repayment. Although the process was difficult, by August all outstanding rent had been cleared and payments were fully up to date. During this period, staff salaries were affected, but by God's grace, these were later regularised.

With continued slow sales, and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we made the difficult decision to close the Point Fortin store. While this was a painful step, it was necessary to help ensure the sustainability of the wider ministry, and we remain committed to repaying the remaining rent owed.

In response to declining shop sales, we significantly expanded our book table ministry in churches. This required extensive preparation and travel, but it proved fruitful. In 2025, we conducted 20 book tables, generating much-needed income and extending our reach.

We are deeply grateful for the support of CLC USA, CLC partners, dedicated staff and faithful volunteers who served sacrificially throughout the year. Despite immense financial and personal challenges, we were continually reminded to trust the Lord fully—and He did not fail us.

United States

In 2025, the ministry was strengthened through a renewed commitment to prayer and generosity. Staff at both the headquarters and the bookshop committed to beginning each workday by praying together, bringing personal and wider CLC needs before the Lord. This daily practice has encouraged unity and dependence on God, and we have been grateful to see many prayers answered.

One of the greatest encouragements of the year was witnessing God's provision in abundance. A significant example was the donation of ten pallets of returned Bibles and Christian resources from a major publisher. These materials have been used in our own bookshop and will also support other CLC fields around the world.

We continued to expand our digital outreach through the YouVersion Bible App. We now offer 18 devotional reading plans based on our books, with four new plans added this year. In 2025 alone, these plans reached over 145,000 new users, bringing total subscriptions to more than half a million. We were also encouraged to join YouVersion in celebrating their milestone of one billion Bible app downloads, marking God's faithfulness in spreading His Word globally.

We thank God for the privilege of sharing His life-changing truth through CLC, and for the ongoing work He is doing in us as we serve Him.

ment following the closure of the Hamburg bookshop will be a very blessed season in their lives.
