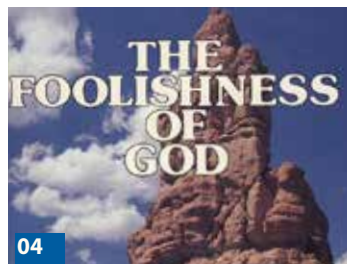

The Obstacle That Became a Global Vision

The first CLC bookshop nearly didn't happen.

In the late 1930s, Ken and Bessie Adams found themselves at a crossroads. They were willing to serve with WEC in East Anglia, but their bookshop in Colchester stood in the way. Should it be closed, sold, or handed over so they could move fully into mission work?

Ken later wrote:

"We were willing to offer our services to WEC but we had a problem... the bookshop. We had no liberty to close it; we were willing to consider selling it or employ someone to carry the main responsibility, which would free us to travel throughout East Anglia in the interest of WEC."

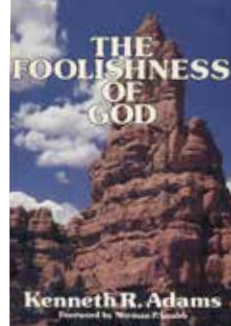
When they shared this with WEC General Secretary Norman Grubb, his response was immediate and decisive: "Close it? Indeed not! We should have bookshops like this all over the country – a chain of Christian bookshops..."

What seemed like a practical obstacle quickly became a widening vision. As they prayed and thought and dreamed, the picture began to grow. Not just one bookshop, but many—across the British Isles and beyond—serving the Church through Christian literature.

Ken reflected on how that vision expanded:

"As we prayed and thought and dreamed, the vision kept enlarging. We could see not only a chain of bookshops across the British Isles, but a chain of bookstores throughout the English-speaking world... and even in other countries where English was widely used. And more, we could become a service agency for the literature needs of missionary societies and the national church around the world."

From this growing vision, a new work began to take shape. On 1 November 1941, the Christian literature organisation under the name Evangelical Publishing House was formally formed. Ken later recorded the simple but significant step of changing the bank account name from "The Bible Depot" to "The Evangelical Publishing House", with himself and Fred Whybrow as signatories.

Yet behind the administrative change lay something deeper. As Ken wrote, the work was ultimately not their own:

"We did not, of course, register with the bank the name of the true Proprietor, but to us and to the rest of our small team of workers, we fully and gladly recognised His Name to be the Lord Jesus Christ."

Bringing Hope Through Literature in Sulawesi, Indonesia

As part of the visit, CLC Indonesia was also able to share hundreds of printed materials with teachers and children through special meetings. These resources were given with the hope that they would help children grow in faith, understand God's Word and mature in their relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

The response was a great encouragement. Through conversations with children's ministry leaders, CLC Indonesia discovered a growing need for more Christian literature. Many expressed a desire for additional resources to support their ministries and help children encounter the truth of Scripture.

PLEASE PRAY that CLC Indonesia will be able to respond well to this opportunity—preparing, supplying and distributing materials so they are available when needed.

Every booklet placed into a child's hands carries the potential to plant a seed of faith. We thank God for the doors He is opening in Central Sulawesi and pray that these resources will continue to point many young lives towards Him.

Serving Together for 85 Years: Ordinary People, Extraordinary Mission

This year, CLC International celebrates 85 years of God's faithfulness.

In 1941, during the uncertainty and hardship of the Second World War, Ken and Bessie Adams stepped out in faith to begin what would become Christian Literature Crusade (CLC). They believed deeply in the power of God's Word to transform lives and in the importance of making Christian literature available to people everywhere. With very limited resources but great trust in the Lord, they laid foundations that would eventually grow into an international ministry serving across many nations and cultures.

What began as a small ministry in wartime Britain has grown into a global movement serving in 42 countries around the world through bookshops, publishing, mentoring national authors, wholesale distribution, websites, conferences, bookmobiles and many other ministries. Over these 85 years, millions of Bibles, Christian books, evangelistic resources and children's materials have reached people in many languages and cultures.

Yet the story of CLC has never simply been about books. It has always been about people and about the Gospel.

Generation after generation, thousands of men and women have faithfully served in CLC—often sacrificially and quietly—as booksellers, warehouse workers, accountants, publishers, translators,

managers, National Directors, trustees and volunteers. Through their dedication, humility, perseverance and passion for the Gospel, countless lives have been touched by the message of Christ.

Having visited CLC teams in many countries around the world, one of the things that has deeply impressed me is the number of CLC workers who have served faithfully for decades. Many have literally dedicated their lives to this ministry, embracing its mission, vision and core values with remarkable commitment. Their faithfulness, often unseen by others, has become one of the great strengths of CLC and part of the spiritual foundation on which the ministry continues to grow today.

At the same time, one of the great encouragements today is seeing many young men and women joining CLC around the world. They bring fresh energy, creativity, technical skills and a renewed

passion for mission. As the world changes rapidly, this new generation is helping CLC engage new audiences through publishing, digital outreach, websites, social media, children's literature, special literature events and creative ministry opportunities.

Although CLC faces challenges in certain countries and regions of the world, we are also seeing significant growth and open doors in many places. CLC ministries across Latin America continue to expand, and the work in India is growing in remarkable ways. In the UK, wholesale distribution continues to grow steadily, and the exciting ReBible project has set a goal of distributing one million Bibles—particularly to younger generations who are searching spiritually and have a deep thirst to know the living God.

CLC's international fellowship also continues to grow stronger. Across cultures and continents, staff and volunteers support one another through prayer, financial partnership, training, encouragement and practical cooperation. This spirit of fellowship and shared mission remains one of CLC's greatest strengths and reflects the vision first established by Ken and Bessie Adams.

This 85th anniversary year also marks an important leadership transition. On July 1, Hervé Lessous from France will begin serving as CLC's new International Director. He follows a long line of faithful International Directors who have helped guide and strengthen the ministry through changing times—including Ken Adams, Bob Gerry, John Silk, Peter Horne, Idris Davies, Neil Wardrope, Gerardo Scalante and Gary Chamberlin.

Each leader served in a different historical context and faced different opportunities and challenges. Each brought unique gifts, personality, experience and leadership strengths entrusted to them by the Lord. Yet through every generation, the central

vision of CLC has remained remarkably consistent: a passion to make Christian literature available so that lives may be transformed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The CLC core values of faith, holiness, sacrifice and fellowship remain the pillars on which the ministry still stands today.

Eighty-five years after its founding, the mission of CLC remains as important as ever. In a world filled with confusion, conflict, loneliness and spiritual hunger, God continues to use Christian literature and Scripture to bring hope, truth, encouragement and transformation.

As CLC International celebrates this milestone, we look back with deep gratitude and forward with renewed faith—trusting that the Lord who has guided CLC through the past 85 years will continue to lead in the years ahead.

Investing in the Next Chapter of CLC's Global Ministry

What will the next chapter of CLC's ministry look like?

Perhaps it will be a Burmese believer receiving a Bible amid civil war. Or a child in India opening God's Word for the first time. Or a Kenyan author being equipped to write for a new generation.

For 85 years, CLC has invested in projects that strengthen ministry for future generations. Today, CLC operates 123 bookshops and 18 warehouses in 43 countries, publishes thousands of books in 23 languages and develops publishing and distribution ministries that help make Christ known around the world.

As we celebrate God's faithfulness over these many years, we are also looking ahead. Four projects in particular are helping prepare CLC for the next decade of ministry and opening new doors for the Gospel.

The Myanmar Bible Project, under the leadership of National Director Jacob Mung, will publish 20,000

copies of the Bible in Burmese. Plans are being finalised for printing later this year. In a nation facing great uncertainty, many are searching for hope and stability in God's Word. Additional funds are still needed for shipping costs from our printer in South Korea so that these Bibles can reach those who need them most.

The Children's Bibles Project is another investment in the next generation. Already, more than 25,000 Children's Bibles have been published and distributed in various countries. In partnership with Tyndale Publishing, over 20,000 additional copies will be printed this summer. We pray that many young lives will be shaped by the truth of Scripture.



New well in Kenya

In Kenya, where the project is being overseen by National Director Mercy Omukhango, a new well is providing fresh water and the foundation of the **CLC Kenya Ministry Centre** has been completed. This faith project will provide a permanent base for ministry, support the growing publishing work in Africa and serve as a writers' retreat where African authors can be mentored and encouraged. Around £42,400 (US\$57,000) is still needed to complete the next phase.

In Chennai, construction continues on the new **CLC–ELS India Building Project**. This four-storey facility will provide space for a large bookshop, offices, a conference room and expanded ministry activities. Approximately £118,000 (US\$159,000) is still needed to complete the next phase of the project and position the work for continued growth and impact.

Behind each of these projects are real people—children, pastors, readers, authors and families whose lives may be transformed by God's Word.

As the Psalmist reminds us: "One generation will declare your works to the next and will proclaim your mighty acts" (Psalm 145:4, CSB).

Reflecting with Gary Chamberlin – CLC's Outgoing International Director.

As I complete my time serving as International Director of CLC at the end of June, I want to express my sincere and heartfelt gratitude to the CLC family around the world.

This year marks 31 years since I joined CLC and began managing the CLC bookshop in Torino, Italy. In time, I became European Director and, for almost five years, I have had the privilege of serving as International Director. Serving the Lord together with my CLC colleagues around the world has been one of the greatest honours of my life.

During those first days as International Director, the Lord placed on my heart a desire to strengthen one of our core values: Fellowship. This was reflected in the themes we embraced together—first, Stronger Together, and now Serving Together. We are stronger when we live and serve as one family across cultures, languages and continents.

Part of this has been encouraging us to support one another intentionally—both in prayer and financially. This spirit has always been part of CLC's DNA from the days of our founders, Ken and Bessie Adams. Countries with available resources have supported projects and stood alongside countries facing challenges and opportunities. We are not simply independent ministries, but one global fellowship.

During these years, I have had the privilege of visiting colleagues in many CLC countries and attending all of our regional conferences. I have also been encouraged by progress in global publishing through initiatives such as the Children's Bibles Project and Myanmar Bible Project, participation in ECPA Rights Fairs, publishing training, building projects and growth in our online presence.

But what I will remember most is not projects, it is my CLC colleagues. You serve with remarkable dedication, sacrifice and passion, and you have greatly inspired me.

I will long remember the smiles, conversations, prayers, shared meals and countless moments of fellowship that have made this journey such a privilege. As Paul wrote, "I thank my God every time I remember you..." (Philippians 1:3).

One lesson I take from this season is this: none of us owns the CLC ministry. We are stewards for a season. Our calling is not to hold on to our position, but to faithfully administer what God has placed into our hands and leave it stronger for those who follow.

Jesus said, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." May we continue serving faithfully for His glory.



Getting to Know Hervé Lessous – CLC's New International Director.

Hervé Lessous grew up in western France in a Catholic family. During his university years, he met Marie, who would later become his wife. At that stage, neither of them had a personal relationship with Christ. However, through a period of questioning and searching about faith and creation, Hervé gave his life to Christ in 1993. He and Marie married the following year.

Before joining CLC, Hervé spent 16 years working in the steel industry in Austria and France. He eventually became the manager of the French subsidiary of an international company. His responsibilities included leadership, strategic planning, financial oversight and frequent travel. Looking back, he recognises that God was using those experiences to prepare him for future ministry leadership.

Around 2001, Hervé and Marie sensed God calling them to serve Him more directly. After several years of prayer and waiting, they learned that CLC France was seeking a National Director. Following further prayer and discussions with CLC leaders, they believed God was opening the door and Hervé took on the role in 2008.

The early years brought significant challenges. Hervé had no background in bookselling or publishing and CLC France was facing serious financial difficulties. Difficult decisions had to be made, relationships with suppliers rebuilt and many aspects of the ministry restructured. Throughout this period, he witnessed God's faithfulness and guidance.

Family has played a vital role in this calling. Marie has supported the ministry through prayer, translation work, proofreading publications and practical help. Together, they have viewed ministry as a shared calling, with their children also participating in events and assisting with CLC book tables.

As he begins serving as International Director, Hervé is encouraged by seeing how God uses Christian literature to impact lives across cultures and nations. He desires to promote unity, fellowship, faithfulness and a continued commitment to CLC's mission of making Christian literature available around the world. He believes CLC must continue serving both locally and globally with vision and humility. A verse that has deeply shaped his life and leadership is John 15:5: "I am the vine; you are the branches... because you can do nothing without me," reminding him that lasting fruitfulness comes from remaining close to Christ.

Pray with Us for the Next Season of CLC International.

For Hervé Lessous as he begins serving as International Director, that God would give him wisdom, strength and guidance as he steps into this new season of leadership.

For CLC International as we enter a new season, that we would continue to serve together in unity, support one another and remain faithful to the mission God has entrusted to us.

For Gary Chamberlin as he moves into a new role with the International Office, that God would guide him and continue to use his gifts in service of CLC's ministry.

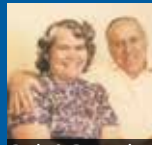

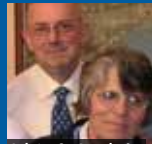
